Moderate wind from S.W. steering N.W. At sunset
huffed to the wind under short sail. Latter part
light wind heading S.W. & under all sail. Employed
stowing salt water in four tubs, and other fits.
Lat. 35, 16 Long 162, 57

Light air with calm steering to be. Latter part calm
but clear the main topsail to mend.

Thursday, Dec. 1st
 Very fast calm. Latter part light variable airs
 from the main topsail and other jibs.
 Lat 35.14 Long 116.11

Friday Dec. 12
 Very part calm. At 6 A.M. breeze sprung up from S.
 heading to W. Employed painting boats.
 Lat. 33.11 Long. 62.34

Wednesday Dec. 15th
Sight large gun Br. steering N. W. Toward
us blackish and got 2. At sunset luffed to
the wind under short sail heading S. W. Latter
part fresh breeze from E. steering N. W. At N.
were ship steering N. W. by W. Passed a sail steering
to N. Started a cask of bread.

Remarks on board Ship Fair Sunday Dec. 16th
Moderate breeze from E. steering N by E. under all
sail. Boiled out the blackfish. At suns etc luffed
to the wind under short sail heading N by E.
After part steering N by N. under all sail
Lat. 33.59 Long. 81.18

Monday Dec. 17th
 Light wind from E. N. E. Steering N. by E. At sun-
 set luffed to the wind under short sail. Sat-
 -ter part fresh breeze. Employed repainting the boat.
 Lat. 32.48 Long. 161.10

Thursday, Dec. 18th
Bright wind from E. N. E. steering N. W. At sunset
luffed to the wind under short sail heading N.
At daylight made sail steering N by E. At 11 A M
strong breeze took in the light sails, and took 2
reefs in the top sails.

Wednesday, Dec. 19th
 Steaming Chicago from St. Steering W. At 2 P.M. spoke
 The City of Sydney, huffed to the wind heading
 E. S. At sunset our ship heading W. & W
 At 9 P.M. saw Lord Howe's Island bearing N.W.
 dist. 35 miles.

Thursday Dec 26
Strong wind from N. heading N by N under easy sail. At
4 P.M. our ship heading E by S spoke the Ulysses again.
Middle part rainy. At 10 P.M. wind hauled N by N.
our ship heading N by N under same sail. The Island
in sight to W by dist 4.5 miles.
Lat 32 13 Long. 111 11.
