Bermarks on board Ship Lion Saturday June 28th
 Fine breeze from N.E. heading N.W. At sunset
 reduced sail. Latter part strong breeze going
 under single reefed topsails.
 Lat. 2.12 Long. 173.25

Sunday June 29th
 Fresh breeze from E.N.E. steering N.W. At sunset
 luffed to the wind under short sail heading N.
 Latter part fine breeze steering N.W. under all
 sail.
 Lat. 10.34 Long. 173.21

Monday June 30th
 Moderate breeze from E. steering N by W. At 2 PM
 lowered for blackfish got none. At sunset
 luffed to the wind under short sail heading
 N.E. At daylight kept off N.W. At 10 A.M. spoke
 the Com. Morris of Yalmouth. Started brief & part
 Lat. 11.32 Long. 174.56

Tuesday July 1st
 Light wind from E.S.E. steering N.W. At sunset
 luffed to the wind aback heading N. Latter
 part steering N.W. in company with the other
 ship. Employed painting the blocks.
 Lat. 10.20 Long. 175.27

Wednesday July 2nd
 Fresh breeze from E. steering N by E. At sunset
 luffed to the wind aback heading N by W. At 2 PM
 hoisted full under short sail. At daylight kept
 off N. under all sail. At 9 A.M. saw the Island of
 New Hanover. Went in two boats after fish
 and birds eggs. Had other ship in company
 No. 55

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Bermarks on board Ship Lion Thursday July 2nd
 Strong breeze from E. laying off the Island. At 3 PM
 the boats came off stood along by the wind
 heading N.E. Latter part N.W. employed
 variously.

Friday July 3rd
 Strong breeze from E. steering N.W. At sunset
 luffed to the wind under short sail heading
 N.W. At daylight kept off N.W. under easy sail
 At 9 A.M. kept her N.W. employed variously.
 Lat. 10.45 Long. 175.36

Saturday July 4th
 Fresh breeze from E. steering S. At sunset luffed
 to the wind heading S.E. under short sail. Latter
 part under all sail. 1 sail in sight to W.
 Lat. 10.07 Long. 176.10

Sunday July 5th
 Moderate breeze from E by N. heading S by E. At 4 PM
 spoke the Com. Morris. Latter part cloudy steering N by E.
 Lat. 10.07 Long. 176.14

Monday July 6th
 Moderate breeze from E.N.E. steering S.W. At 3 PM lowered
 for sperm whales struck and killed him and
 took him to the ship. At daylight commenced
 to cut get him in and made sail heading N.
 by the wind. Employed clearing away.
 Lat. 10.23 Long. 179.07
