

Remarks On Board Ship

Sunday Dec 27th 1847

First part light wind from the South and fine weather heading E.S. at 4 p.m. saw and heard for blackfish got four at 5 p.m. first forlance heading E.S. since first sight latter part calm two sail in sight 2 masts Lat 35 37 Long 1.00 E

Monday 28th

Commenced with light air from the S.E. and fine pleasant weather heading to the Eastward since 8 latter part calm 3 masts three sail in sight Lat 35 51 Long 1.29 E

Tuesday 29th

Calm with calm and clear weather since 8 latter part light air from the S.W. and fine pleasant weather steering S.E. and sail in sight 3 masts Lat 35 34 Long 2.24

Wednesday 30th

First part light wind from the S.W. and fine pleasant weather steering S.E. and sail in sight humplacks growing to the Westward however once 10 by the gun could not get a chance since part gentle wind from the S.W. and pleasant latter, strong from the Westward and rain employed in bracing out for water and stowing down oil 2 masts Lat 35 34 Long 2.24

Thursday 31st

First part strong wind from the S.W. and squally with rain 2 masts under double reef at 5 p.m. got through steering steering S.E. since part fresh gale from the S.W. latter part strong gale and rigged up longed signals with a Dutch Buss 2 masts

Friday Dec 31st 1847

Commenced with strong wind from the S.W. and rugged steering S.E. since part more calm out of reef latter part moderate ship with all sail out the Buss in sight 3 masts Lat 37.25 Long 12 30 E

Saturday January 1st 1848

Commenced with light wind from the Westward and cloudy steering S.E. since 8 latter part strong wind and some thick fog Lat 37 45 Long 15 00 E

Sunday 2nd

First part strong wind from the Westward and some cloudy steering S.E. with all sail out since 8 latter part strong wind and squally with rain 2 masts Lat 38.10 Long 17.10 E

Monday 3rd

First part strong wind from the W.N.W. and squally with rain steering S.E. with all sail out since 8 latter part moderate and a sail 2 masts Lat 38.48 Long 21 30

Tuesday 4th

First part gentle wind from the S.W. and some rain steering S.E. with all sail out since part gently with rain latter part gentle wind from the S.W. at 4 p.m. spoke the Barque George of West Amsterdam homeward to Batavia 2 masts Lat 38 33 Long 24.30

Wednesday 5th

First part gentle wind from the S.W. and fine pleasant steering S.E. with all sail out since 8 latter part gentle wind from the S.W. and cloudy 2 masts
