

Remarks On Board Ship Liverpool

Sunday June 11th 1848

First part light wind from the westward and some rain falling to the south. Mid part light air and rain. Latter strong wind from the south and fine clear sun in cloud to the land saw nothing off. Clear to the north. Stays & rig running to the south.

Monday 12th

First part strong wind from the north and fine clear weather. Steering to the south and sunset. Latter part strong wind from the north and rugged saw one hundred and thirty. Steering to the south in the forenoon. Lat 38.55 Long 139.11

Tuesday 13th

First part strong wind from the north and rugged. Steering to the north. Mid part strong wind from the north and cloudy. Steering to the north and saw one hundred and thirty. Lat 38.00 Long 138.00

Wednesday 14th

First part strong wind from the north and cloudy. Steering to the north with all sail out at sunset. Latter part light air and fine. Steering to the north. Lat 38.40 Long 138.30

Thursday 15th

First part light air from the north and fine. Clear weather. Steering to the north with all sail out. Mid part light. Latter moderate wind from the north and fine pleasant weather. Lat 40.00 Long 137.50

Friday 16th

First part light wind from the north and fine pleasant weather. Steering to the north. Mid part light air and fine. Latter part light air and fine. Steering to the north. Lat 40.00 Long 137.50

Saturday 17th 1848

First part light air and fine weather at 1.30 p.m. Landed and struck a whale and killed him at 4.5 p.m. took him to the land and commenced cutting at 8.30 p.m. cutter for the night at 4 p.m. could all hands and sent to cutter at 7 p.m. got through made sail and saw and shot whales without success. Plenty of whales in site. Lat 40.00 Long 138.30

Sunday 18th

First part light air from the north and fine weather at 1.30 p.m. Landed and struck a whale and killed him at 4.5 p.m. took him to the land and commenced cutting at 8.30 p.m. cutter for the night at 4 p.m. could all hands and sent to cutter at 7 p.m. got through made sail and saw and shot whales without success. Plenty of whales in site. Lat 40.00 Long 138.30

Monday 19th

Clear with light air and fine pleasant weather. Employed in cutting. Spoke the bark of E. Donnell of New Bedford. Steering to the north. Lat 40.00 Long 138.30

Tuesday 20th

First part light air from the north and fine. Clear weather. Steering to the north with all sail out. Mid part light. Latter moderate wind from the north and fine pleasant weather. Lat 40.00 Long 138.30
