

Monday July 24th 1845

First part strong gale from the Eastward and thick weather took in sail
Mid & latter part strong gale and rainy with the fore sail down

Tuesday 25th

Came with strong gale from the E.S.E. and some thick ship under close reef main top sail Mid part moderate latter part gentle wind from the E.S.E. and fine pleasant weather with all sail set & land in sight and one ship
Lat 42 15 N Long 133 10 E

Wednesday 26th

Came with gentle wind from the S.E. and fine pleasant weather heading to the E.S.E.
Mid & latter part strong wind and thick rainy heading to the E.S.E. and double reef top sails and main sail and p.s. S.E.

Thursday 27th

Came with strong wind from the E.S.E. and fine pleasant weather thick rainy saw and chased a whale killed a hump back Mid part more clear latter clear saw and heard for two whales one ship in sight came in thick fog &c

Friday 28th

First part light air from the Eastward and thick fog Mid part light air from the S.W. and thick rainy steering to the E.S.E. & dug

Saturday 29th

First part light wind from the Westward and thick fog steering E.S.E. Mid part thick latter part calm and clear 4 ships in sight 3 of them sailing &c Lat 42 46 Long 135 46
The land in sight

Sunday July 30th 1845

First part light air from the Eastward and clear heading S.E. at 5 p.m. thick fog Mid & latter part gentle wind from the S.W. and thick fog heading to the E.S.E. &c Long 137 15

Monday 31st

First part gentle wind from the South and quite clear heading S.E. Mid & latter part gentle wind from the S.W. and thick S.E.
Lat 43 40 Long 138 42

Tuesday Aug 1st 1845

First part gentle wind from the S.W. and thick steering S.E. Mid and latter part light air and fine weather the land in sight one ship &c Lat 43 05 Long 140 00

Wednesday 2nd

First part light air and fine pleasant at 3 p.m. spoke the ship Sarah Parker of Nantucket 38 m. out 2000 lbs. this season Mid & latter part calm the about 8 miles off &c Lat 45 21 Long 140 00

Thursday 3rd

First part strong wind from the East and fine clear weather heading to the S.E. saw a hump back Mid & latter part strong wind from the S.E. and fine weather with the mouth of Porpoise strait between through &c

Friday 4th

First part light wind from the S.E. and fine clear weather heading to the Eastward & the land in sight Mid & latter part light wind from the S.W. and fine at 5 p.m. saw and chased whales at 8 p.m. put the thimble in the main rigging and gave him 300 and that him was for refusing to pull in the thimble and was doing &c
