

Wednesday Sept 12 1848

Came with calm and clear about 10 miles from the land towards and shot a mass of ducks. Mid. & latter part light wind and fine weather. Ship starting to the North at 11 A.M. heard for two whals got one at 12 A.M. took him to the ship and floated in S.E.

Thursday 13

Came with light wind and fine weather. The land in sight and several sail at 10 got through cutter and started to work. Mid. & latter light wind and thick rain employed in killing S.E.

Friday 14

Came with light wind and thick rain. Mid. & latter part strong gale saw several whals. S. E. got through killing.

Saturday 15

Came with strong wind and clear. Mid. & latter part more moderate sun and clear whals several ships in sight started 12 o'clock down in the tanks S. E.

Sunday 16

Came with light air and a heavy swell on at 7 A.M. spoke the Sloop Belton of fair haul 20 M. out 35 o'clock. Mid. & latter part strong wind spoke the Paratoga of San Pedro 40 o'clock 35 M. out saw and clear whals S. E.

Monday 17

First part strong wind with a heavy swell on at 4 P.M. spoke the Thetate. Mid. & latter part strong gale with a heavy swell on at 11 A.M. clear kept the main 1/2 sail and took in the fore sail S.E.

Tuesday Sept 13 1848

Came with a heavy gale from the E.S.E. and some rain. Ship heading to the S.E. under close reef main top sail. Mid. part blowing heavy. Latter part rain from the N.W. and more moderate down ship to the S.E. S. E.

Lat 48 34 Long 131 34 E.

Wednesday 13

Came with more moderate at 3 P.M. saw ship to the N.W. and set the fore sail. Mid. & latter part light air from South and fine weather saw and clear whals several whals in sight S. E.

Lat 48 31

Thursday 14

Came with light winds and fine weather saw and clear whals at 5 P.M. spoke the Thetate with 10 o'clock S. Paratoga wanting one whal. Mid. & latter part gentle wind and some thick S. E.

Lat 48 30 Long 130 15 E

Friday 15

Came with gentle wind and thick (coming to the North) Mid. & latter part gentle wind from the Westward and thick heavy at 10 A.M. spoke the Bayne Newburgher of Stonington 13 M. out 14 o'clock. Lat 48 28

Saturday 16

Came with strong wind from the S.E. and thick saw and clear whals. Mid. & latter strong gale and thick rain ship under close reef main top sail and different thick S. E.

Sunday 17

Came with strong gale from the S.E. and thick rain. Mid. & latter part strong wind and a heavy swell sail saw and clear whals several ships in sight. Lat 48 25 Long 148 35
