

Tuesday Dec 13th 1848

First part strong gale from S.E. and squally. Boat
reft the top sails some equally inconsistent with
the Micas. Mid. of latter rather more moderate
shook out one reef out of the main top sail and set
the jib. Steady S.W. S. Lat 20.05 Long 124.13

Wednesday 13th

First part strong wind and clear under short
sail. A. kept coming on with the Micas. Steady S.W.
Mid. of latter part strong wind and rugga
equally at 6 A.M. kept off. Steady W. S. under
single reef with the main top gallant sail out
at 10 A.M. made the Northern Bassie Island
bearing N.E. at 12 past then Steady W. S. S.

Thursday 14th

First part strong trades and squally Steady
W. S. Mid. of latter strong and rugga
Lat 21.40 Long 118.33

Friday 15th

Came with strong wind and rugga Steady
S.W. Mid. part more moderate. Latter part
light air from the S.W. and some misty
at daylight saw the Land of Breakers Point
bearing N.E. at 10 miles. heading N.E. in company
with the Micas saw 10 miles of high boat. Lat
22.31 Long 115.41

Saturday 16th

First part light air and pleasant. 1, 12, 1, 1, 1, 1
saw, Pudu, Branca, Rock
Latter light air got a pilot. Lat

Sunday 17th

First part light air and fine pleasant weather
running in amongst the islands
at 10 A.M. came to anchor in
George's Bay in 10 fathoms water

Monday January 18th 1848

First part light air and fine pleasant
Latter part light wind here short and got a
red light for sea. Lat

Tuesday 11th

First part gentle wind and fine weather
at 4 P.M. took our anchor and stand out
at 5 A.M. two large the Pilot of the Steady our
Highland. Latter part strong wind from the S.E.
heading S.E. at 10 A.M. took the ship to the North
S.E.

Wednesday 12th

Came with gentle wind from S.E. S. S. ship
and different tracks Mid. of latter part the same

Thursday 13th

First part gentle wind and fine weather ship and
different tracks Mid. of latter part the same

Friday 14th

First part gentle wind and fine pleasant weather
heading and different tracks in line of the Eastward

Saturday 15th

First part gentle wind from S.E. S. and fine
weather ship and different tracks Mid. of latter
the same saw the Blanche rock

Sunday 16th

First part strong wind from S.E. and squally
double reef the top sails and reef the main sail
Mid. of latter part much the same S.E.
