

Remarks On Board Ship Liverpool

Wednesday January 17th 1845

First part strong wind from the S.W. to E.S.W. ship
on different tacks under double reefs. Mid. D
later part much the same. Lat 21. 56 Long 118. 05

Thursday 18th

First part strong wind and rugged sea
that the ship took some ship on different
tacks mid. D same. Later more moderate
shook out the reef S.W. Lat 21. 51 Long 118. 01

Friday 19th

First part strong wind from the S.W. ship heading
E.S.W. and the main top gaff sail lost a
knot overboard. Mid. part strong wind
saw a schooner. Later part more moderate
ship with all sail out heading East. Lat 21. 44 Long 118. 50

Saturday 20th

First part gentle wind from the S.W. and fine
weather heading East with all sail out
Mid. part strong wind double reef. Later moderate
at daylight saw the Island of Formosa the Point
Barney I.P.R. Lat 23 miles S.W. Lat 21. 53 Long 120. 16

Sunday 21st

First part strong wind from the E.S.W. heading E.S.
double reef the top sail at dark reef the main
sail. Mid. D better part more moderate and
all sail past close to the Island of Borneo to Pago Minna
Lat 21. 35 Long 121. 60

Monday 22nd

First part light wind from the S.W. and some squally
Mid. D later part fresh wind from the S.W. and
thick rain heading E.S.W. Lat 20. 03

Bonaire in to the Eastern Sea

Wednesday January 23rd 1845

First part light rain and rain
Mid. part strong wind from the S.W. and
thick rain heading E.S.W. Later must the
same heading East to E.S.W. Lat 20. 03

Thursday 24th

Clear with gentle wind from the E.S.W. and
thick rain heading E.S.W. 22. 50
Mid. D better part fresh breeze and clear heading
E.S.W. Lat 22. 50 N. Long 125. 2 E

Friday 25th

Clear with strong breeze from the S.W. and
cloudy heading E.S.W. ship four top sail
Mid. part strong wind and rugged heading E.S.W.
Later strong wind at 7 P.M. that ship to the South
Lat 22. 34 Long 125. 18 E

Saturday 26th

Clear with strong wind from the E.S.W. and
cloudy heading North. Mid. D better part strong
wind from the S.W. and some cloudy steering
North to E. Lat 24. 28 Long

Sunday 27th

First part strong wind from the South East and
rainy steering North. Mid. D strong gale from the
S.W. and rainy ship under double reef top sail
Later part strong gale and squally took in four
and seven top sails at 11 P.M. set them again
heading S.W. Lat 25. 34 Long 127. 00 E

Monday 28th

First part strong gale from the S.W. and squally heading S.W.
under double reef top sail. Mid. D better part more
moderate shook out the reef ship on different tacks
saw a ship S.E. Lat 26. 03
