

Sunday March 4th 1845

First part heavy gale from the S.W. and rugged
and snow ship under close reef main & sail
and reef four sail heading to the S.W.
Mid & latter part moderate at 8 A.M. wore S.P.
to the Westward and ship in sight of land
Lat 37° 16' Long 134° 09'

Monday 5th

First part fresh wind and squally with snow
heading to the Westward
Mid & latter part light wind and fine weather
at 8 A.M. saw four right whales at 11 A.M. heard
and struck one S.S. & ship in sight West part

Tuesday 6th

First part light wind from the Westward and
fine weather at 4 P.M. took the ship to the ship
commenced cutting at 9 got through
Mid & latter part strong gale. At daylight started the
North S.S.

Wednesday 7th

First part strong gale from the S.W. and squally
Mid strong gale from the S.W. and some rain
Latter strong gale and clear at 8 A.M. spoke the ship
Mid & latter part strong gale. At daylight started the
North S.S.

Thursday 8th

First part strong wind from the North and clear
Mid & latter part strong wind and fine weather at 4 P.M.
got through. Boiling heading to the S.W. & S.
Lat 37° 12' Long 135° 00'

Friday 9th

First part light air and fine pleasant weather heading S.W. with
the tide to the S.W. Mid part calm. Latter part gentle
wind from the S.W. and fine pleasant weather heading to the Westward
to the S.W. & S. Lat 36° 55' Long 134° 00' E

Saturday Mar 10th 1845

Calm with gentle wind from the S.W. and fine
pleasant weather heading to the S.W. at dusk took in
sail Mid & latter moderate winds and
some thick rain at 8 A.M. heard and struck
two whales S.S.

Sunday 11th

First part light air and some thick lower
twice for whales saw 4 whales & ship in sight
Mid & latter part light air and fine weather at 8 P.M.
struck two whales at 11 A.M. heard and struck three
with out success to end Lat 37° 37' Long 133° 40' E

Monday 12th

Calm with light air and fine weather
Mid & latter part light air and fine pleasant
weather at 6 A.M. struck two whales at 8 A.M.
heard and struck about twenty whales S.S.
clearing

Tuesday 13th

First part light air and fine weather
at 1 P.M. struck a whale and the two ship parted
and lost the whale saw a great many whales to
day Mid & latter part gentle wind and some thick
lower and struck two whales S.S.

Wednesday 14th

Calm with gentle wind from the S.W. and thick
rainy Mid strong wind and rugged
Latter part light air and some thick struck two
whales S.S. Lat 37° 10' Long 132° 41'
