

Saturday April 25th 1845

Came with light air and fine weather at 4 p.m. lowered for two whales struck and killed one at 5 took him to the ship took in sail Mid & better moderate at 6 healt on at 10 got through saw and chased whales and ship in site &c Lat 38.25

Sunday 26th

Came with light wind and some rain Mid part the same latter strong wind from the N.W. and clear heading to the S.W. started the works &c Lat 38.45 Long 134.55

Monday 27th

Came with strong gale from the N.W. and rugga heading to the S.W. Mid and better part moderate saw plenty of whales struck one and saw two last the whale at 12 got through Boiling plenty of whales in site &c Lat 38.25

Tuesday 28th

First part calm at 3 p.m. struck and killed a whale at 8 took him to the ship and took in sail Mid & better part light air and fine weather at daylight healt on at 10 got through saw two ships cutting &c Lat 38.55 Long 135.35 E

Wednesday 29th

First part light air and fine weather at 4 p.m. the Hamilton of Liverpool 10 m out with whale 200 fms off Mid & better part strong wind and some rain at 9 p.m. lowered struck a cow and calf got one Beat store got the calf sporting blue &c lines got cut from the cow and calf they started to the windward and lost them blowing and raining hard &c

Saturday April 26th 1845 Thursday

First part strong wind from the Eastward and fresh rain came down Mid & better part strong gale and rugga &c

Friday 27th

Came with strong gale from the S.W. and rugga on different tails Mid & better part more moderate started the works &c Lat 38.35 Long 135.00

Saturday 28th

Came with moderate gale from the S.W. with a heavy swell on Mid and better part more moderate saw and chased whales at 11.30 got through Boiling &c Lat 38.33 Long 135.25 E

Sunday 29th

Came with gentle wind from the E.S.E. and fine weather saw and chased whale 3 ships in site filled up the tanks Mid & better part strong wind and rugga commenced Rowing &c Lat 38.00

Monday 30th

Came with strong wind and rugga at 3 p.m. spoke the ship the ton of Liverpool & whales this season got through starting Mid & better part strong wind from the S.W. and rugga saw a whale going quick to the westward &c Lat 38.15 Long 135.02

Tuesday May 1st 1845

Came with strong wind from the S.W. and rugga heading to the Eastward saw and chased two whales Mid & better part strong gale and rugga plenty of ships in site &c Lat 38.02
