 Mon. Nov. 17th All these 24 hours strong breeze
 from the S.E. steering N by E with all sail up at 9 AM
 saw sperm whales  at 10 AM
 passed to sea at 11 AM took 1000 lbs along
 commenced butting &c. &c.
 Lat. by obs. 13. 17 Long. by Chron. 171. 55 West

Tue. Nov. 18th All these 24 hours strong winds
 from the S.E. employed butting at 2.30 finished
 at 4 P.M. got the head cleared away and set the
 sail latter employed in butting &c. &c.
 Lat. by obs. 14. 28 Long. by Chron. 171. 25 West

Wed. Nov. 19th Strong trade and passing clouds
 at 1 P.M. saw sperm whales  and the whales
 went down saw nothing more of them at 5 P.M.
 returned to the ship wind from S.E. steering N by
 E employed butting at 4 AM finished butting &c.
 Lat. by obs. 14. 35 Long. by Chron. 171. 25 West

Thu. Nov. 20th All these 24 hours strong trade steering
 N by E with all sail on pleasant weather latter
 the fore & gallant sail & bent another &c.
 Lat. by obs. 15. 55 Long. by Chron. 170. 32-30 West

Fri. Nov. 21st All these 24 hours strong trade steering
 N with all sail we set the sail down in the
 blubber run at 9 A.M. saw the island of
 Cootavillak S.E. part bearing N.N.E. Dist 20 miles
 Lat. by obs. 14. 30 Long. by Chron. 170. 25. 15 West

Sat. Nov. 22nd Strong trade at 5 P.M. sent a
 boat on shore for a pilot to take the ship
 & tacked to the south at midnight tacked to the N
 at 1 A.M. kept off for the harbor at 8 A.M. saw
 two in the harbor in 17 bottoms latter an English
 privateer they along here &c. &c.

 Wed. Nov. 23rd light trade & pleasant weather at 10 AM
 the boat on either & beat out of King a King, Walla
 King &c. &c. &c.

Thu. Nov. 24th light winds steering N by E and
 eastwesterly latter two boats on shore trading for
 King &c. &c. &c.

Fri. Nov. 25th light trade the boat on shore
 trading at 9 AM came on board latter employed
 fitting the boath at 10 AM the Champion
 with 200 bbl of muscovee bay &c. &c.

Sat. Dec. 1st light trade in company with
 the Champion at 2 AM left of the Island
 for game &c. &c.

Sun. Dec. 2nd light air from north on a wind
 to the N. & W. at 4 P.M. went on shore latter
 sent latter light air & calm Apolow about 40 PM

Mon. Dec. 3rd light breeze from north lying
 of and at 4 P.M. went on shore for game
 latter got two boat load of their ends this day

Tue. Dec. 4th light air from north at 4 P.M.
 the boat got off with all the game steering N.W.
 at 8 A.M. Apolow bore south Dist 50 PM strong
 trade & pleasant weather steering N.W. &c.
 sent out the fly jib boom & bent the sail
 sent up the foremast &c.

Wed. Dec. 5th light trade & equally light
 and steering N.W. by N latter employed fitting
 the boat rigging and back stay &c.
