Sun May 2nd Strong winds employed
repairing sails with the exception of 1 hour
50 min. but 1800 lbs. of sail hauled out 1800 lbs. of sail

Wed May 29th Light wind & calm employed repairing
sails of the South Point of Survey

Thu May 30th Strong winds and heavy squalls
under double reefed sails of the South part
of Survey the hilly & hilly in sight

Fri May 31st Strong gales from the S.E. & S.
standing to the S.W. on a wind under Chart
sail at 3 P.M. tacked to the eastward at mid-
night past to the S of the W point of Survey
Lat. in 13. 28 N Long 174. 30 W

Sat June 1st Smart gales from S.E. & S. lying to the
under the lee of Survey employed in repairing sails
& painting the boats &c. Lat. 13. 50 N Long 174. 30 W

Sun June 2nd Strong gales from the S.E. & S.
lying under the lee of Survey with a breeze
from the eastward where the latter light airs &
calms bearing to the West
Lat. in 13. 44 N Long 174. 40 West.

Mon June 3rd Strong breezes bearing S.W. & W. from
S.E. in company with the idea of S.W. wind
Latter thick and rainy employed at tacking the
cabin Lat. by 13. 44 N Long 174. 40 W

Tue June 4th Strong trades bearing S.W. & S.
and light weather under double reefed sails
the idea in company with the
regard after sperm whales

Wed June 5th Strong breezes bearing S.W. & S.
in company with the idea of S.W. wind

Ship Log in the Pacific Ocean 1839
Thu June 5th Strong trades bearing to the West
at 7 P.M. left on a wind to the S at midnight
were ship to the S.E. at 8 P.M. kept off 10 P.M.
employed tacking up the rigging and at tacking the
cabin at 10 P.M. saw the land bearing S.W.
Lat 20 P.M. there I by 17. 10 N in company
Lat. by 17. 14 N Long 174. 40 W

Fri June 6th Strong trades and blazes at 8 P.M.
past to the eastward of the island made lying
on and on latter went on shore but some gales
Lat. by 17. 14 N Long 174. 40 W

Sat June 7th Strong trades of the island made
the land rather fine from the North standing
to the S.W. under Chart sail
Lat. in 17. 14 N Long 174. 40 W

Sun June 8th Light trades and calm bearing
to the S.W. under double reefed sails latter
employed in ship's duty
Lat. by 17. 14 N Long 174. 40 W

Mon June 9th Pleasant trades and a smooth
sea bearing to the South & S.W. latter fine
a breeze to the Westward
Lat. by 17. 14 N Long 174. 40 W

Tue June 10th Light trades and pleasant
weather bearing to the S.W. at 9 P.M.
tacked to the S.E. at 2 P.M. were ship to the
South latter fine weather and very smooth
Lat. by 17. 15 N Long 174. 40 W

Wed June 11th Light trades bearing on a wind
to the S.W. at 2 P.M. saw the ground of shore
Lat. by 17. 15 N Long 174. 40 W
