

Bark Annamora Cruising off the Azores Islands
A.D. 1860

Wednesday Aug 29th

Begins with a strong N.W. breeze Bark heading S. at sunset took in sail and came ship heading S.W. Lat. part made sail heading S. S. ends there 24 hours
Latitude 39° 03' North
Longitude 51° 22' West

Thursday Aug 30th

Begins with a strong S.W. wind Bark heading S.W. at 2 P.M. saw the Islands of Flores & Corvo at 5 P.M. came ship heading S.W. several sails in sight at sunset spoke the Bark Kingfisher of New Bedford Russell 3 months out with 180 bbls. Lat part made sail of stone S.W. by S. Flores in sight so ends there 24 hours
Latitude 39° 02' North

Friday Aug 31st

Begins with a strong E. wind Bark heading S.E. at sunset took in sail. Lat part made sail Pico St. Leger in sight bearing S.E. distance



70 miles (Pico St. Leger) ends there 24 hours in the
Latitude 38° 20' North

Saturday Sept 1st

Begins with a light E breeze Bark heading S.W. Pico St. Leger in sight at sunset took in sail Lat part at day light made sail so ends there 24 hours

Sunday Sept 2nd

Begins with a light S.W. breeze Bark heading S. Pico St. Leger in sight at sunset took in the light sail the Islands of Flores and St. George in sight so ends there 24 hours

Monday Sept 3rd

Begins with a light S.W. breeze Bark heading S.W. the Islands of Flores, Pico St. Leger & Securin in sight at sunset took in sail Lat part at day light made sail so ends there 24 hours

No Obs

Tuesday Sept 4th

Begins with a strong S.W. wind Bark working up for the Island of Securin. 2 P.M. boat went on shore at the town of Payer. at sunset boat came on board, took in sail and stood off shore. Lat part boat went on shore at the town of Payer so ends there 24 hours

Wednesday Sept 5th (Bark Dy. 37.38)

Begins with a strong S.W. wind Bark lying off shore at 6 P.M. receded off stood off shore. Lat part at 11 A.M. stood off from the Island so ends there 24 hours

Thursday Sept 6th

Begins with a strong E wind Bark steering to the windward of Securin. St. George & Ince in sight at 9 A.M. come to anchor at Fayal. 13 fathoms depth. 11 A.M. 200 men went on shore. 2 P.M. 1st mate and once got clear for the ship so ends there 24 hours
