Saturday May 25th

Ship's hour begin with a strong E by S breeze
Bank heading N E by E. Air quite moderate
breeze so end these 24 hours Latitude 28 16 North
Longitude 30 32 West

Sunday May 26th

Beginning with a monelicate S & breezy Breeze h. or
E. S. & Wind & hat put light & breezy so much that
Lat. $49^{\circ} 13'$ North
Longitude $55^{\circ} 21'$ West

Monday May 27th

Begins with a light S. then Bank Steering & Wind
 & then put light breeze Painted cardboard war
 Latitude 28° 18' North
 Longitude 53° 18' West

Yours truly May 25th

Begin with a light S. by E. breeze. Bark heading
S. by E. one sail in sight at sunset the boat crew
watched, but found one sail in sight in sight so over
there 24 hours. Latitude 29° 15' N. Longitude

Thursday May 2nd

Monday May 3rd
 Began with a light N. E. breeze & back heading
 N. E. & but part the same so that there is heavy
 Latitude is 12 North

Thursday May 30th

Begins with a light SW breeze backing to E
 at sunset shortened sail but put sea all in
 so in 24 hours
 Latitude 30.27 North
 Longitude 57.5 West

Friday May 31st

This morn'g being with a light S.W. breeze Back
 heading S.W. & at 11 o'clock spoke the Bark
 "Civilian" of Fairhaven one year out with 500 Blk
 sperm to land; this day Latitude 33° 57' N. Longitude 51° 50' W.

Saturday June 1st

Beginning with a strong S. breeze. Bark heading
 S.W. Bark Quilicura in sight at sunset took in
 sail. But just made sail one sail in sight so
 and, took 24 hours. Latitude 30° 15' North
 Longitude 50° 30' West.

London, June 18th

Begins with a strong E wind. Bulk heading
 N. then sail in sight, boat put at 10. The sun
 the Bulk Civilian macking 8 at 11. The
 saw her boat, down chasing, half landed on the
 S. boat, but within 500 yds. saw the C. take a
 whole along side to end, then 24 hours
 Latitude 51° 38' North
 Longitude 59° 33' West

Monsey June 4th

Beginning with a light S. by E. breeze, Bark starting from the wharves at 1 P. M. lost sight of them at sunset took in sail, but put almost no towhee heading her so ended there 24 hours.

Leeds 24 June 8th

Begin with a light to the bridge Bank heading to G
at some took in soil, Got part heavy Rainy weather
to end, there 24 hours
Latitude 35° 56' North

Latitude 28° 56 North
