Remarks on board Tuesday 24th

First part plenty of rain Latter part clear weather resumed in getting of wood aboard this day

Remarks on board Wednesday 25th

Fine weather through this day hands employed in painting ship and mending sails sailed this day

Remarks on board Thursday 26th

First part rainy Latter clear hands employed in painting aboard this day the Troop Bird sailed to day

Remarks on board Friday 27th

First part fine weather Latter part the same hands employed in painting aboard this day

Remarks on board Saturday 28th

First part fine weather Latter part at 10 AM got under way and steered S.W. out of Prince Rupert harbor bound for the western ground sailed this day

Remarks on board Sunday 25th

First part light wind under the lee of Grand Culpe steering N.N.W. Middle and Latter part fresh wind steering N.W.B.W. at 8 AM past St. Eustatius at noon past St. Martin sailed this day

Remarks on board Monday 31st

First part fresh wind and fine weather seen by the wind to the S at 6 PM past Sombere island 5 miles to the eastward of it from which I took my departure Middle and Latter part fresh wind from E.N.E. sailed Lat 19° 50' N Long 63° 24' W

Remarks on board Tuesday 31st

First part fresh wind from N.E. seen by the wind heading N.B.E. Middle and Latter part the same sailed Lat 21° 13' N Long 63° 27' W

Remarks on board Wednesday April 1st

First part fresh wind from N.E. to E.N.E. seen by the wind heading N.E. Middle and Latter part the same seen heading N.E. sailed this day Lat 22° 36' N Long 63° 27' W

Remarks on board Thursday 2nd

First part fresh wind from E seen heading N.E.B.W. Middle strong wind Latter part more moderate sailed this day Lat 23° 57' N Long 63° 31' W
