Remarks on board Bark Louisa, bound
from Nantucket to New Bedford

This day at 2 P.M. weighed anchor and
left Nantucket in all its glory and stood for
Cape Cod & other sail in sight

Tuesday 25th

For these 24 hours lying off and on at Cape
Cod on shore for letters at 4 P.M. bark
came on board made all sail and stood to
the southward

Wednesday 26th

For these 24 hours squally weather steering S.E.
employed in stowing anchors & chains nothing
in sight save the heaving ocean

Thursday 27th

For these 24 hours squally standing to
the S.E. employed in small jobs

Friday 28th

For these 24 hours variable employed
nothing in sight all anxious for a fair
wind

Saturday 29th

For these 24 hours the same employed
in fitting ship nothing in sight

Sunday 30th

For these 24 hours squally nothing doing standing
on the wind heading Southward

Monday 1st to Wednesday 10th

For these 10 days variable winds employed in
fitting boats. repairing sails. setting up & fitting rigging
wind from the N.E. standing on the wind on the larboard
tack nothing sighted since leaving the Sandwich Isles

Thursday 11th

For these 24 hours a fair wind set the studding
sails sent down new mizzen sail & sent
the old one nothing in sight as usual
a sailor's pleasure nothing save the rolling Ocean
