

Bark Louisa bound to Salcahuano
" Monday Dec 28. 1857

Commences with a gale of wind ship under close reef main topsail split fore to mast staysail Middle part blowing a streamer. Latter part wind hauled to the Westward sent up fore to mast & put reefs in running off under an gallant sail and double reef fore to mast employed in setting up Last fore to mast back stays

" " Tuesday 29th
For these 24 hours running off under all sail course E by N employed in setting up M. to mast back stays

" " Wednesday 30th
Commences with a strong breeze steering E by N employed in breaking out water in fore hole setting up fore to mast rigging Middle & Latter parts a fine breeze retained staysail and sent it

" " Thursday 31st
For these 24 hours a fine breeze steering East under all sail employed in repairing fore to mast

" " Friday Jan 1st AD 1858.
Commences with a fine breeze from the Westward steering East by N employed in small jobs painting line covers & deck buckles the Old man killed 5 large hens to celebrate New Year's day. Middle part squally carried away our studding sail boom in Mr. Branston's water

" " Saturday 2nd
For these 24 hours a stiff breeze sent up a new fore to mast studding sail boom & broke out beef & water so ends these 24 hours

" " Sunday 3rd
Commences with squally weather steering E by N under all sail Middle part squally doubled, hauled the coils & furled the main sail Latter part made all sail a stiff breeze

" " Monday 4th
Commences with a strong breeze attended with squalls of rain Middle part a light breeze standing on the wind Latter part the same employed in breaking out shocks on the starboard side of the fore peak

To discharge her Oil William Bathaway Master
" Tuesday Jan 5th AD 1858.

Commences with a light breeze standing on the wind employed in stowing away shocks & shock heads making out Bread & Flour Middle & Latter parts the same employed in breaking out Fish Vinegar & Flour so ends these 24 hours

" " Wednesday 6th
For these 24 hours standing on the wind to the Eastward employed in breaking out Beef Pork & Hides

" " Thursday 7th
For these 24 hours a light breeze employed at small jobs in the rigging

" " Friday 8th
For these 24 hours a light breeze employed in small jobs in want of a fair wind

" " Saturday 9th
For these 24 hours a light breeze standing on the wind employed in ships duty

" " Sunday 10th
For these 24 hours nothing doing Cooper to Anderson at work at Lunard. Back at ship's time

" " Monday 11th
For these 24 hours the same employed in small jobs nothing in sight

" " Tuesday 12th
After a while we are favoured with a fair wind steering E by N look in studding sails Latter part fine but the studding sails wind from the SW steering E by N caught a Porpus and had a fine mejs

" " Wednesday 13th
For the first part of these 24 hours a stiff breeze at sunset took in studding sails Middle part calm Latter part a stiff breeze on the wind

" " Thursday 14th
Commences with squally weather look in the light sails Middle & Latter parts fine

" " Friday 15th
For these 24 hours a light breeze standing on the wind to the N by E employed in small jobs
