

Remarks on Board Bark Louisa

Monday March 29th AD 1858
For these 24 hours employed in cutting in & clearing away heads at 3 P.M. started the works at sundown decks washed off and made sail stowing &c.

Tuesday 30th
For these 24 hours boiling nothing in sight all hands employed.

Wednesday 31st
For these 24 hours boiling. Blubber fat nothing in sight.

Thursday 1st April
Commenced with a fine breeze steering N.W. at 3 o'clock cooled down and put on fat lean & washed off decks. Middle part fine. Latter part the same employed in cooping oil. Cropped the time.

Friday 2nd
Commenced with a light breeze steering N.W. employed in cooping. Middle part fine. Latter part employed in stowing down oil in after hold.

Saturday 3rd
Commenced with thick weather wind variable at 2 o'clock finished stowing down and washed ship. Middle part calm with squalls of rain. Latter part calm employed in cleaning out between decks. Stowed down 65 lbs.

Sunday 4th
For the first and middle parts of these 24 hours calm steering N.W. Latter part squally with rain steering N.W. by the wind.

Monday 5th
For these 24 hours a strong breeze attended with squalls of rain employed in picking over potatoes. Nothing in sight.

Tuesday 6th
Commenced with squally weather took in the light sails. Middle part the same. Latter part

Friday April 23rd 1858
Commenced with squally weather took in the studding sails & light sail steering N.W. employed in making spun yarn. Middle part the same. Latter part a strong breeze employed in ship's duty.

Saturday 24th
For these 24 hours a strong breeze steering N.W. by N. employed in hauling out water. Molasses, Pinegar. Flour. Fish. Pickles &c. nothing in sight.

Sunday 25th
Commenced with a fine breeze steering N.W. by N. under all sail. Middle part the same. Latter part a fine breeze steering N.W. by N. on the wind.

Monday 26th
For these 24 hours variable winds steering S.W. by the wind heading S.W. the W. employed in ship's duty. Capt. B. Hathaway unwell his eye very painful.

Tuesday 27th
Commenced with variable winds heading S.W. by the wind employed in making a new fore lift. Middle part the same. Latter part a strong breeze. Capt. suffering with his eye no sleep for 48 long hours which reminds me of the vessel, crew the sailors restful pillow far far at sea.

Wednesday 28th
For these 24 hours a strong breeze steering N.W. by N. rainy put 2 reefs in the fore topsail at 10 A.M. moderated made sail. Capt. Hathaway's eye no better.
