

Remarks on board Bark Louisa

Thursday 2nd For these 24 hours a strong breeze steering N.W. by W. Capt. & crew better nothing in sight

Friday 3rd For these 24 hours a strong breeze from the E. steering N.W. by W. very rugged employed breaking out water

Saturday 4th Commences with very rugged weather steering N.W. by W. employed in shipping blocks for S.W. Boat Middle part the same Later part employed in small jobs making a hog house

Sunday 5th Commences with a strong breeze from the E. steering N.W. by W. under all sail Middle part the same Later part the same nothing doing sailing along over the wide waste of waters thoughts of home and friends

Monday 6th For these 24 hours a fine breeze steering N.W. under all sail employed in small jobs repairing main sail

Tuesday 7th For these 24 hours variable winds employed in setting up old shooks no ends this 24 hours

Wednesday 8th For these 24 hours foggy with rain sharp on the wind heading S.E. Employed in making a hog house put 2 reefs in fore topsail &c. carried away fore topmast studding sail boom

Thursday 9th For these 24 hours variable winds heading S. & N.W. set the studding sails & repaired lower studding sail & picking over potatoes & putting them below

Bound to the Okhotsk Sea 17

Friday 10th Commences with a fine breeze steering N.W. under all sail employed in storming off fore mast beating out but Middle part fine Latter part the same

Saturday 11th For these 24 hours thick foggy weather saw five backs employed in ships duty

Sunday 12th For these 24 hours variable winds saw hump backs weather cool nothing doing

Monday 13th Commences with fine weather steering N.W. under all sail saw five backs 240 miles from the passage Middle part the same Latter part thick fog

Tuesday 14th For these 24 hours a thick fog steering N.W. by W. no observation

Wednesday 15th For these 24 hours blowing a stiff breeze Middle part blowing a gale of wind ship under close reef main topsail Latter part fine & clear

Thursday 16th Commences with a stiff breeze steering N.W. under all sail Middle part took in light sails in two reefs in topsails. Latter part calm land on the Larb beam

Friday 17th For these 24 hours light airs trying to get through the passage 3 sails in sight trying to get in
