

Remarks on Board Bark Louisa about
A.D. 1858
Monday 31st
Commences with a light breeze running off at 5 P.M. the Old Man went on board of the Levi Starbuck Middle part laying aback Latter part at daylight
Said Brothers, Levi Starbuck, & Louisa in the Ice at 8 A.M. worked out a boat from the John Coggeshall came on board Capt Lambert after plank having stove his ship in the Ice kept along with her all day with Levi Starbuck, Concord & Maynard & ends this 24 hours

Tuesday 1st
Gause
For the first part of these 24 hours along with John Coggeshall at 7 A.M. the Old Man went on board of the Navy to help away a few hours Middle part calm Latter part the same set in thick a boat from ship Navy, along side Mr Gifford on board at 9 A.M. returned on account of fog employed in filling water in fore hold & ends this 24 hours

Wednesday 2nd
For these 24 hours thick dirty weather with rain ship under short sail no ice in sight

Thursday 3rd
For these 24 hours the same no whales in sight hard timed 3 sail in sight trying to get to the S.W.

Friday 4th
For these 24 hours a thick fog under short sail 3 sail in sight running along the Ice

Saturday 5th
Commences with thick fog spoke Levi Starbuck & jammed with her & Bark Kingfisher Middle & Latter part a thick fog

The Old Man Sea from P. O. Hathaway
A.D. 1858
Monday June 6th
Commences with thick fog 3 sail in sight heading to the westward employed in repairing after starb David which broke off to the rail while lowering away the boat Middle part a thick fog under double reef topsails coasts, furled Latter part the weather mild but thick wind from the S.W. heading to the S.W. 3 sail in sight beating up employed in breaking out water ice on the lee beam

Monday 7th
Commences with thick fog 3 sail in sight heading to the S.W. under easy sail Bark Lagoda on the weather sea shook reefs out of the topsails & at the fore sail Middle part a thick fog Latter part the same wind from the S.W. steering W by N For the first part a light breeze hauled on the wind on the Bark took in a field of small ice Latter part at daylight kept off again steering West nothing in sight save the white fields of Ice no whales as yet

Tuesday 8th
Commences with a light breeze steering to the S.E. fog as usual Middle part the same in the Ice Latter part fog in the Ice furled the coasts and ckd down topsails nothing in sight hooked to a large Island of Ice and hove it along side & commenced getting ready to fill casks with fresh water from the well in the Ice & ends this 24 hours

Wednesday 9th
Commences with a light breeze steering to the S.E. fog as usual Middle part the same in the Ice Latter part fog in the Ice furled the coasts and ckd down topsails nothing in sight hooked to a large Island of Ice and hove it along side & commenced getting ready to fill casks with fresh water from the well in the Ice & ends this 24 hours

Thursday 10th
Commences with a light breeze steering to the S.E. fog as usual Middle part the same in the Ice Latter part fog in the Ice furled the coasts and ckd down topsails nothing in sight hooked to a large Island of Ice and hove it along side & commenced getting ready to fill casks with fresh water from the well in the Ice & ends this 24 hours
