

Bark Louisa Bound to Saghalin Bay

Thursday
29th

Commences with fresh breezes from the S.W. heading N.E. picked up and cut in a small dead whale Cape Maria bearing N by E Middle part fine breezes from the S.W. and good weather two boats in shore looking for whales employed boiling the ship in 7 fathoms water bent the port cable

Wednesday
June 30th

Commences with fine breezes from the S.W. boats returned not seeing any whales kept off to the N.W. out the gulf. Middle & Latter part light winds from the N.W. by the wind S bark in sight

Thursday
July 1st

For these 24 hours a light breeze from the S.W. steering by the wind thick foggy weather saw a sail

Friday
2nd

Commences with light winds from the W the fog lighted up at 1 P.M. Benicki Island 10 miles distant and Penchiloff 30 miles towards Cape Nichitell At 6 P.M. wind S.E. steering S.W. Middle part steering N.W. Latter part foggy wind N.W. steering by the wind to the S.W.

Saturday
3rd

Commences with a light breeze from the N.W. spoke ship Roman with 3 whales saw Kasiff Island bearing S.W. and Prokofieff bearing N Middle part thick with rain thunder and lightning Latter part thick wind from the N by the wind under all sail working to windward

Sunday
4th
July

Commences with a light breeze from the N with a thick fog steering by the wind working up toward S.W. Wash Bay at 8 P.M. saw Prokofieff 4 mile distance Middle & Latter parts thick fog

Monday
5th

For these 24 hours a thick fog wind from the N working to windward saw four backs wind hauled to the S steering N.W.

Tuesday
6th

Commences with a light breeze from the S steering N.W. a thick fog luffed to at 3 P.M. heading W.S.W. up the bay Middle part laying back Latter part a light breeze from the S.E. steering N.W. made the land near Cape Zaisiff A ship in sight
Lat per Obs 56.00 N

Wednesday
7th

Commences with light winds and fair weather near the land but thick off shore wind S.E. steering S.W. down the coast at 9 P.M. anchored near rocky point Middle part fresh breezes drove up again at 5 A.M. working up the bay three boats off in pursuit of whales Latter part light winds from the E.S.E. anchored in 20 fathoms water 5 ships at anchor " " " "

Thursday
8th

Commences with light winds from the E.N.E. and rainy boats returned at 4 P.M. saw nothing of any importance Middle part rainy at 9 A.M. took up anchor drifting up the bay with the tide Latter part calm saw white Grampus and one whale going quick
