

Louisa About S. P. Bay
 Wednesday July 21st Latter part Larb boat struck a whale turned him up & a thick fog boat laying by the whale at 3 o'clock while firing gun as signals to the boat by the dead whale the Canon burst killing Thomas Dean of Germantown Penn., and wounding Capt Hathaway near the hip joint Thomas Dean's remains were buried on the South shore of Naski Bay at 11 boats took Larb boats whale along side

Accident

July 22nd

Friday July 23rd At 1 o'clock commenced cutting in at 5 P.M. finished cutting and cleared up decks commenced boiling Latter part at 3 A.M. boats left ship at 5 A.M. Starb. boat struck killed whale Starb & Bow boats laying by the whale ship 10 miles distant at anchor boiling

Saturday July 24th Commenced with thick weather ship under weigh at 4 P.M. come to anchor and took Starb. boat whale along side employed in boiling two whales in the bladder room & along side Middle part a fresh breeze Latter part cutting in & boiling waisted Starb. boats off after whales

Sunday July 25th For these 24 hours thick rainy weather boats off no wind and whales shy employed in boiling Capt Hathaways wound much better boats returned on account of rainy squally weather

So ends these 24 hours

 Monday July 26th Commenced with a light breeze from the Eastard got under weigh at 3 P.M. and cleared fowl anchor employed in boiling and stowing down Middle part thick dirty weather employed boiling " " "

Tuesday July 27th For these 24 hours thick rainy weather finished boiling employed in stowing down weather looking heavy " " "

Wednesday July 28th Commenced with dirty weather at sunset finished stowing down Middle part wind from S.E. blowing a Gale of wind ship laboring heavy broke all the patent windlass gear and started rorser pipe Latter part at daylight got under weigh with hand spikes heading out the bay " " "

Thursday July 29th For these 24 hours blowing a Gale from the E. N.E. standing across the bay on different tacks with a thick foggy " " "

Friday July 30th For the first part of these 24 hours thick rainy weather ship under short sail standing across the bay Middle part more moderate let go the anchor Latter part calm & clear boats off saw boat on whale

Saturday July 31st Commenced with calm & clear at 6 P.M. got under weigh with a light breeze from the E. steering up the bay at 8 P.M. let go anchor Latter part light winds & foggy boats off whaling
