

Remarks On Board Bark Louisa Bound
Tuesday
September
21st

Commenced with light winds from the S.W. and cloudy steering to the N.E. A ship in sight. The land 12 miles off. Middle part calm, latter part a strong breeze from the W. boats down chasing whales

Wednesday
22nd

Commenced with light winds and good weather. Lark Boat struck a whale turned him up and took him along side at 8 P.M. and commenced cutting. Middle part strong breezes dragged cutting. Latter part at 7 A.M. finished cutting a fresh breeze from the W. heading in shore. Three ships in sight.

Thursday
23rd

For these 24 hours fine light breezes from the W. working in shore employed in boiling two boats off in shore in pursuit of whales. At 4 A.M. a Kanaka died he had been unwell some time. Bow Boat took him on shore for burial it being rugged boat could not land was obliged to bury him at sea.

Friday
24th

For the first & middle part strong breezes & rainy employed Boiling. Latter part dirty weather cooled down blowing a stiff breeze

Saturday
25th

For these 24 hours blowing a gale from S.W. under short sail

Sunday
26th

For these 48 hours more moderate heading in shore. Three sail in sight. Finished Boiling

Monday
27th

Along the North Shore 4th 1858
Tuesday
28th

For these 24 hours fine weather employed stowing down in fore hold. The Land distance 10 miles steering N.E. A sail in sight. Lat 38.26 N

Wednesday
29th

For these 24 hours light winds from the W. steering along the coast. A Bark in sight. Lat 38.55 N

Thursday
30th

Commenced with light breezes from the S.W. and fair weather steering to the S.E. Middle & Latter parts the same. No Abn. " "

Friday
October 1st

Commenced with light breezes from the S.W. steering S.E. sent up the 5 Gall yard & sail at 6 o'clock saw a large Bow Head near the ship. Covered the Boats it being soon dark. Lost sight of him took up the boats middle & latter parts the same. Lat 38.56 N Long 145.56 E

S. To
Tuesday
12th

For these 12 days cruising about for right whales and working out of the sea spoke on the 7 Bark Phidas. Tallman New Bedford bound to the Sandwich Islands. To day it being the 12th at daylight saw the Island of Peromackia. Latter part strong breezes from the W. and squally clearing through the passage. Lat 4.56 N Long 155.18 E

Saturday
16th

October

For these three days wind from the N.W. steering E. & S. thick rainy weather all anxious to get down to the Islands after an 8 months cruise
