

Remarks on Board Bark Louisa Sound

Saturday  
October 10<sup>th</sup>  
Commenced with a strong breeze from the W and thick weather during E by N. at 1 P.M. while furling the main sail the hook that was attached to the stings gave way throwing 6 men on deck and one over board killing one instantly and wounding all the rest lowered a boat as soon as possible and rescued the one in the water took him on board closed down topsails & hauled up the courses to hoist the ship to and took the wounded below set the bones that was broke and dressed their wounds Manuel Berges had his leg broke below the knee " Cooper James No. Turner of New York had his wrist broke and a very bad cut over the left eye the rest seem to be quite easy they escaped with bad bruises but no broken limbs At 5 P.M. hauled back and after reading a few passages of scripture & remarks from the Captain we gave the body of our deceased Shipmate to the Deep where the cold winds blow the sailor sleeps " " " after getting all comfortable sent up stings to the yard made all sail and kept off her course E by N. Middle & Latter parts a strong breeze from the W steering E by N Cooper failing fast he takes no notice and suffers so ends these sad 24 hours " " " "

Sunday  
11<sup>th</sup>  
Commenced with light breeze and good weather at 10 A.M. Cooper breathed his last Middle part a strong breeze and rugged Latter part ship rose to under close reef main top sail Bury the Cooper with funeral ceremonies

Monday 18<sup>th</sup>  
For these last three weeks passage nothing but gales of wind employed in washing ship Bone & repairing rigging  
November 15<sup>th</sup>  
" " Commenced with fine breeze from E S E and good weather steering S by W Middle & Latter parts the same at 10 A.M. made Hawaii bearing S W distance 50 miles  
Lat per Ob. 21. 21 N Long 155. 50 W

Tuesday  
November 16<sup>th</sup>  
Commenced with fresh breeze from the S E and good weather steering N S W for the passage between Hawaii to Morotui at 9 P.M. in the passage Middle part laying aback off Hawaii Latter part cut on shore with Bow Boat ship Recalmed but returned with the News Potatoes, Beef, Letters &c &c

Wednesday  
17<sup>th</sup>  
At 3 O'clock came to an anchor in 15 fathoms water furling sails &c &c Middle part fine Latter part employe getting a raft on shore &c &c

Thursday  
18<sup>th</sup>  
For these 24 hours fine weather employed in discharging Bone on Board Clipper ship Yorick of New Haven Bone

Friday  
19<sup>th</sup>  
Fine weather employed in washing ship outside & getting a raft of desks on shore for water

Saturday  
20<sup>th</sup>  
For these 24 hours employed in breaking out Oil for shipment

Sunday  
21<sup>st</sup>  
A fine day all hands on shore save one boats crew & Mr. Brandon

Monday  
22<sup>nd</sup>  
These 24 hours fine employed in shipping Oil on board Clipper ship Yorick for New Bedford
