28th
" For these 24 hours fine employed
in small jobs, Harbord watch on
Liberty

Saturday For these 24 hours employed in
2^d th stowing down fresh water and
" various other jobs Tarboard Watch
on Liberty "

Monday
28th
For 12 hours strong
buzes from the Port and raining
employed in ships duty Starb
Watch on Liberty

Monday
29th
" All these 24 hours clear weather
employed in getting off small stores
took a raft on shore for fresh water

Tuesday
30th
For these 24 hours fire employed
in small jobs getting off Provisions
Stowing down water finished Painting

Wednesday
December
1st
" For the 24 hours thick unsettled weather at 2
Pm blowing a gale Ship Ship Yorkick
dragged some distance at 4 Pm wind veered
to the north gale abated we lay with
our starb anchor down with a scope of chain
50 fathoms

Thursday
December 2nd
For these 24 hours thick overcast
weather employed in small jobs
clearing up decks & getting ready for

3rd

For these 24 hours strong trades variously employed in ships duty

Saturday
4th
" For these 24 hours fine weather,
getting off small stores & various other
small jobs getting off crew with
their things &c &c &c

Sunday
5th
" Commences with strong trades at 4 AM
weighed anchor and left Lahaina in
company with Bark Makachasitto for
Oahu. Middle part fine weather at
3 PM hauled aback under Hamon Head
Latter part laying off and on Capt
to one boat's crew on shore. Bark
Makachasitto off and on

Monday For these 24 hours lying off and on
6th one boat on shore.

Tuesday
5th
" "
Commenced with fine weather and a light breeze lying off and on took two anchors and 50 fathoms of chain in a scow along side of bark Massachusetts one belonging to the Louisa did not return to the ship at night being late with the scow - Middle part a fine breeze off and on Latter part the same kept on shore for small recruits

Wednesday
8th
" Commenced with a fine breeze at 3 P.M.
Capt came on board, squared the sails
and steered to the Southward for New
Zealand in company with the Massachusetts
with a crew of 30 all told. Lost one
man in Oahu by desertion. Middle &
Latter part of a light breeze steering S. lat. 19. N. lon. 166. 45 W.
