

Bark Louisa, Tearing, Ochotok Sea  
" Sunday April 24<sup>th</sup> "

Commences with thick rainy weather at 2  
PM wind hauled from S to S by W and increased  
to a gale ship under close reef main topsail  
at dusk set a close reef fore topsail still raining  
Middle part more moderate at the fore sail  
Latter part a strong breeze from the NNE  
heading S by N nothing doing " "

" No Observation  
" Monday 25<sup>th</sup> "

Commences with a strong breeze from the NNE  
standing on the wind heading S by S under  
all sail weather thick air cool  
Middle & Latter parts the same

Tuesday 26<sup>th</sup>

For these 24 hours blowing a gale from  
the S by W standing on the wind under  
double reef topsails & courses air cool  
Lat 38 1/2 N

Wednesday 27<sup>th</sup>

Commences with a gale from the S by W  
standing on the wind a ship passed us  
under short sail at sunset sea rough  
the topsails & furled the courses Middle  
part the same Latter part moderating  
standing to the S by E under double reef  
topsails & foresail nothing doing

Thursday 28<sup>th</sup>

Commences with a light breeze  
from S by W standing on the wind to  
the S by E under all sail Middle  
part the same Latter part a fine  
breeze from the S by W steering S under  
all sail employed in small jobs  
Lat per Obs N Long 15

Friday 29

Commences with a strong breeze from S steering  
S under all sail rose new canvas lower main rigging  
Middle part

" Saturday 30<sup>th</sup> "

Commences with a strong breeze from the  
steering S by W under all employed in ship's  
duty at 6 AM parted fore topsail tie lifts  
& fore brace sent tie aloft again and close reefed  
the fore topsail wind increasing to a gale  
at 10 AM hove to under a close reef main  
topsail wind hauled to the S by W cold & stormy  
" " No observation "

" Sunday 1<sup>st</sup> May "

For the first & Middle part of these 24  
hours under close reef main topsail with  
a heavy sea running Latter part more  
moderate made sail wind from the  
S by W heading S by W by the wind  
Lat per Obs 45 30 N Long East

" Monday 2<sup>nd</sup>

For these 24 hours a strong breeze from  
the S by W steering S by W under easy sail  
employed in dewatering out water & repairing  
fore topmast staysail sent it out again  
" " Lat per Obs 46 15 N Long E

" Tuesday 3<sup>rd</sup>

Commences with a strong breeze from the South  
& thick rainy weather steering S by W under  
double reef topsails & foresail broke out bread  
& put up the stove Middle & Latter parts  
a light breeze from the S by W steering S by  
the wind to S by E " "

" Wednesday 4<sup>th</sup>

For these 24 hours a light breeze from the  
S by W steering S by the wind under all sail  
nothing doing all wishing for a fair wind to  
get to the Ochotok Sea passage 130 miles distance  
bearing S by W by observation

" Thursday 5<sup>th</sup>

For these 24 hours beating about with a  
head wind & thick fog " "  
" No Observation "
