

Barck Louisa to the NE of St. Jonas Island
" " " Bound to the North Shore."
" Thursday June 8th AD 1859."
Commences with a fine breeze from the
SW steering NE under all sail employed
in getting out Oars for start boat. Middle
part a fine breeze from the SW steering NE
under all sail. Latter part the same at
1 P.M. raised the main land ahead
at daylight got the anchors off the bow
and bent the cables.

" " " Lat 59.18 N Long
" Friday June 9th "
Commences with a light breeze from SW
steering NE looking for Horse Shoe Bay came
to anchor in the Bay at 10 P.M. fished
the sails & turned in at 3 P.M.
called all hands lowered the 3 Larbo
Boats and started for Strait shore
in a dense fog raised 2 Bow heads
from the ship boats all off
ends thus 24 hours

" " " Saturday 10th "
For these 24 hours at anchor in Horse
Shoe Bay. Boats all off looking for
whales returned at sunset without seeing
a spot

" " " Sunday 12th "
This day at 3 A.M. weighed anchor and
stood off of the Bay & ship in sight
a fine breeze steering West under all
sail. A ship at anchor off Bird Island

" " " Monday 13th "
Commences with a fine breeze from
steering West under all sail. Middle part
calm. Latter part a fine breeze from
standing on the wind to the NE. Land
20 miles distant no sight for
Bow Heads as yet " "

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Running down North Shore June 14th 1859
" Tuesday 14th "
Commences with a fine breeze from the
standing off & on looking for whales
sighted Devil fish at 4 P.M. standing
off shore heading SW Middle part the
same fished a Carcass the first the
season. Latter part a thick fog wind
from the Westward steering by the Wind
heading North so ends thus 24 hours

" " " Wednesday 15th "
Commences with a light breeze from
the Westward on the wind heading
to the North with a thick fog
Middle & Latter part the same

" " " Thursday 16th "
Commences with a fine breeze from
the SW standing on the wind to
the Westward under all sail. A thick fog.
Middle part the same. Latter
part a light breeze & thick weather
steering SW by S. under all sail
" Lat per Obs 57.12 N Long

" " " Friday 17th "
For these 24 hours a fine breeze from
SW steering NW. Thick rainy weather
nothing doing worthy of note

" " " Saturday 18th "
Commences with a fine breeze from
the NE steering W by S. Thick rainy weather
at 6 P.M. took in the light sail &
hailed up the main sail. Middle part
dirty weather at 3 P.M. Big Phantom Isle
1 mile distant wind died away let go
anchor rainy. Latter part the same
laying at anchor on the West side of
Big Phantom Island with a 20 fathom
scope of chain out a heavy swell.
