Friday 28<sup>th</sup>  
For these 24 hours wind to the  
SSE steering S by S under all sail employed  
in ships duty all wishing to get to the  
Sandwich Islands  
Lat for Obs 43.30 N Long 179.11 E

Saturday 29<sup>th</sup>  
For these 24 hours a light breeze  
employed in small fogs breaking out  
provisions etc "No Observation"

Sunday 30<sup>th</sup>  
For these 24 hours a light breeze from  
the SSE steering by the wind under all  
sail employed in ships duty  
Lat for Obs 42.25 N Long 179.00 West

Monday 31<sup>st</sup>  
For these 24 hours a strong breeze from the  
SSE steering by the wind under topsails  
& courses all wishing for a fair wind  
nothing in sight save the wide waste  
of waters  
Lat for Obs 44.00 N Long 180.00 West

Tuesday November 1<sup>st</sup>  
Commences with a strong breeze from the SE  
steering by the wind under short at 4 PM put 2 reefs  
in main topsail Middle part under easy sail  
Later part the same wind from the  
SE standing on the wind on the starb tack

Lat for Obs 39.15 N Long 177.20 West  
Wednesday 2<sup>nd</sup>  
For the first & middle part of these  
24 hours a gale from the SE standing on  
the wind under close reefed topsails  
Fore & Main spinnaker & Fore topmast staysail bearing  
N.E. Latter part the same nothing doing  
" " "No Observation"

Thursday 3<sup>rd</sup>  
For these first 12 hours blowing a gale  
from the ESE fore & under close reefed  
Main topsail & Fore topmast staysail Latter part  
moderate made sail employed in getting  
Pot stay & setting it up again  
Lat for Obs 40.39 N Long 176.20 West

Friday 4<sup>th</sup>  
Commences with fine weather wind  
from the Eastward & heavy swell coming  
from the SE employed in stowing  
Pipes of Water between decks that started  
during the gale Middle part calm  
Latter part a light breeze from the West  
steering E by N under all sail at the  
studding sails employed in breaking out  
Water & scraping Bone  
" " "No Observation"

Saturday 5<sup>th</sup>  
For these 24 hours a light breeze from  
the W steering E by N every thing set  
employed in scraping Bone & filling  
old dikes  
Lat for Obs 41.00 N Long 174.00 West
