

Remarks on Board Bark Louisa, in the
Sunday 25th

Commenced with a strong breeze from the E
staring by the wind heading S by E under all
sail employed in small jobs in the rigging
Middle part a strong breeze at 11 o'clock
our ship began to pitch while out after Parpus's
fell over board, we lowered a boat for him
but he sunk before we could reach him
it being very dark at the time, we searched
about in hopes of finding him but in vain
and thus returned to our ship without our
brother shipmate. He died far away over the
white foaming billows. Where no hand was
near him to smooth his watery pillow.

Lat 6.10 N Long 154.30 W
Latter part a strong breeze from the East
staring S by E under all sail set the St. Foremast
studding sail, nothing in sight. a lonely day.

Commenced with a strong breeze from the East
staring S by E under all sail nothing doing
Middle part the same Latter part a
fine breeze staring S under all sail

Lat 6.45 N Long 153.07 W

Tuesday 27th
For these 24 hours a strong breeze from
the E & E under all sail set the lower & St. Foremast
studding sails squally with
rain employed in small jobs bent a new main
top gallant sail. Broke out a new fore sail & topsail

Wednesday 28th

Lat 6.15 N Long 153 West

Commenced with strong trades from the E and good weather staring
S by E employed in raising our rufstachels, spails, halliards &c. &c.
Middle part squally Latter part fine set up the St. Foremast
studding sail, boom and sent out the

North Pacific Ocean Homeward bound
Thursday 29th

Commenced with a fine breeze from
the East staring S by E under all sail
Middle part & Latter part the same
employed in small jobs about the ship
" " Lat 6.51 N Long 155.52 W

Friday 30th
For these 24 hours a fine breeze from
the E staring S by E under all sail weather
squally with rain employed in
breaking out water &c.
" " Lat 7.24 N

Saturday 1st
Commenced with variable
with squalls of rain to
bent a new fore topsail
the same Latter part
the E staring S by E under
18.24 N

Sunday 2nd
For these 24 hours a strong
staring S by E under all
the Island of Nootka ahead
at 10 o'clock went aboard
lowered the Star Board. Soft
arrangements for wood Ship
Ship Addition. all homeward

Monday 3rd
For the first part of these 24 hours off and on
at the Island at sunset boat returned with
the Capt. having taken on board 6 cord of wood, Fruit
Coconuts, Towels &c. &c. Middle & Latter parts a strong
breeze staring S by E under moderate sail
