

Remarks on board bark Louisa bound towards  
" Saturday 14<sup>th</sup> January  
For these 24 hours light variable winds from  
the N.W. standing on the wind making South  
employed in reefing studding sails sent down F. Royal  
yard saw spails on the weather bows so good  
" Lat per Obs 34.03 S Long 145.50 East

" Sunday 15<sup>th</sup>  
Commences with a light breeze from the East  
steering by the wind heading South under all  
sailing Middle part the same Later part  
a light breeze & fine weather nothing doing  
" Lat per Obs 35.13 S Long 145.20 W

Monday 16<sup>th</sup>  
For the first part of these 24 hours calm  
Middle part a fine breeze from the E.N.E.  
steering S.E. Later part a fine breeze steering  
S.E. by E under all sail at daylight sent out the  
studding sails employed in setting up head & feet  
" Lat per Obs 36.00 S Long 144.50 W

Tuesday 17<sup>th</sup>  
Commences with a fine breeze from the E.N.E.  
steering S.E. by E under all sail employed in  
small jobs about ship Middle part calm  
Later part squally with rain wind hauled  
to the S.W. set the studding sails course S.E.  
" Lat per Obs 37.06 S Long 142.44 W

Wednesday 18<sup>th</sup>  
Commences with a light breeze from the N.W.  
steering E by S under all sail Middle part  
squally hauled in studding sails & took in the  
light sail wind variable Later part at  
daylight wind out to the N.W. and fine weather  
sent out our flying jibets &c employed in  
small jobs about the ship making Bunt  
Gaskets &c &c nothing in sight  
" Lat per Obs 38.04 S Long per Chron 140.31 W

Thursday 19<sup>th</sup> January

For these 24 hours a strong breeze from the  
N.W. steering E by S under a heavy reef of  
sails variously employed nothing have  
we seen since leaving Koratongo.

Lat per Obs 38.33 S Long 137.00 W

" Friday 20<sup>th</sup>  
Commences with a strong breeze from the West  
with thick hozy weather Middle & Later parts  
equally with rain employed in ships duty

" Lat per Obs 38.57 S Long 133.58 W

" Saturday 21<sup>st</sup>  
For these 24 hours variable winds & thick  
weather working to the Eastward employed in  
ships duty Lat per Obs S Long W

" Sunday 22<sup>nd</sup>  
For these 24 hours variable winds & squally  
weather heading S.E. on the fore tack  
took in the Mast Boat and put the overhead  
nothing in sight saw the sea birds

Lat per Obs 40.01 S Long 132.28 W

" Monday 23<sup>rd</sup>  
For these 24 hours a strong breeze from  
the N.W. steering on the wind heading E by E  
variously employed in small jobs

Lat per Obs S. W.

Tuesday 24<sup>th</sup>  
For these a strong breeze from the East  
standing to the S.E. under moderate  
sail cool squally weather nothing doing
