

Bark Louisa bound towards Cape Horn 1860

" Wednesday 25th

For these 24 hours strong breezes from the N.E. attended with squalls of rain standing on the Starb tack heading E.N.E. nothing doing weather cool nothing moving about here

" Thursday 26th

For these 24 hours the same Easterly winds thick weather air cool employed in small jobs about ship

" Friday 27th

For these 24 hours strong squally breezes from the E.S.E. standing on the wind on the Starb tack heading South under short sail nothing doing worthy of note no prospect of a fair wind

" Saturday 28th

Commences with strong breezes and thick squally weather heading S on the wind Starb tacks aboard Middle part calm latter part the same a light breeze from the S.W. steering E by S sent out the studding sails

" Sunday 29th

Commences with a light breeze from the S.W. steering E by S under all sail Middle part the same latter part a strong breeze from the S.W. steering E by S under all sail

" Monday 30th

For these 24 hours a strong breeze from the S.W. attended with squalls of rain took in the light sails nothing doing worthy of note

" Tuesday 31st

For these 24 hours a strong breeze from the S steering E by S under moderate sail

Off Cape Horn. entering the South Atlantic

" Monday 13th February 1860

Commences with squally weather wind S.W. steering E.N.E. under short sail passed a clipper ship bound West. Middle part squally with rain wind variable latter part calm nothing in sight

Lat 56.44 S. Long 69.18 West.

" Tuesday 14th

Commences with a light breeze from the N.E. steering by the wind on the Starb tack heading East the Diegoes 3 points off weather bow bearing E.N.E. distance 25 miles Middle part light variable winds from the N to N.E. latter part a light breeze from the N.W. steering E.N.E. a Merchant Bark passed off our bow steering to the E.N.E. French Bark Juno

" Wednesday 15th

Commences with a light breeze from the N.E. steering by the wind heading E by S under all sail Middle part calm latter part a light breeze from the West steering N.E. under all sail

" Thursday 16th

For these 24 hours light breezes from the N.W. steering N.E. attended with squalls of rain exchanged signals with an English Bark steering to the S.W. employed in ships duty

For the first and Middle part of these 24 hours light variable winds and rainy latter part a fine breeze from the South steering N.E. under all sail
