employed in breaking out water from Forehold
& filling casks with salt water 3 sail in sight

the N. staring by the wind 7 sail in
sight employed in the rigging
Lat per Obs 24.55 Lon 27.38 W

Monday 19th

For these 24 hours light variable winds
from the N. staring by the wind under all
sail employed in the rigging 4 sail
in sight
Lat per Obs 21.24 Lon 26.19 West

Tuesday 20th

Commences with a light breeze from
the N. and fine weather staring by the
wind under all sail employed in the
rigging 3 sail in sight Middle & Latter
parts the same Lat 20.50 Lon 27.15 W

Wednesday 21st

For these 24 hours light variable
winds from E.N.E. to S.E. staring N. under
all sail at the studding sails
employed in the rigging
Lat per Obs 20.24 Lon 27.10 West

Thursday 22nd

For these 24 hours light breezes from the
E.N.E. staring N. under all sail employed
in the rigging rattle down &c &c
crossed the Fore royal yard & set the sail
Lat per Obs 18.40 Lon 28.12 West
