

Bark Louisa Crossing the South Atlantic

" Friday March 23rd 1860

Commenced with a light breeze from the E & E steering north under all sail employed in the rigging battling down & the middle part a light breeze latter part the same employed in the rigging

Lat. per Obs 18.25 S Long 28.12 W

Saturday 24th

For " " 24 hours a fine breeze from the E & E steering N under all sail employed in the rigging

Lat. per Obs 17.04 S Long 28.56 W

Sunday 25th

For " " 24 hours the same steering N under all sail, exchanged signals with English Merchant Ship John Reed of London steering E & E

Lat. per Obs 15.20 S Long 29.40 W

Monday 26th

Commenced with a light breeze from the E & E steering N under all sail, middle part the same. Latter part wind SE steering N at the studding sails employed in breaking out water, Bread, Provisions & Oil

Lat. per Obs 13.16 S Long 30.18 West

Tuesday 27th

For " " 24 hours fine breeze from the SE steering N by W under all sail employed in painting mast heads & yards nothing in sight as usual

Lat. per Obs 11.07 S Long 31.07 W

Friday 28th

Commenced with fine breezes from the SE employed in painting Yds & c Middle part the same Latter part the same

Lat 9.14 S Long 32.00 W
