This Day Begins with fresh winds from the N.W. steering by the S.W. saw several sail at 7 AM ship to the N. Middle part the same at 5 AM ship to the N. at 9 AM saw a school of Sp. Whales some struck one & killed her at 12 noon heard long loud 2 ends

Sunday 6th

This Day Begins with strong winds from the N.W. heading to the N.E. & under short sail cramped in Bailing at 6 AM at the Middle part had a heavy sea got one man hurt by a leak of oil last part of gale of wind & rain lat 46. 39. 05 Long of Lk 41. 05

Monday 7th

This Day Begins with a strong gale from the N.E. heading to the N.E. & under short sail at 4 P.M. finished Bailing Middle & last part 1 PM began another lat 46. 39. 15
Long of Lk 40. 65

Tuesday 8th

This Day Begins with strong gales from the N.W. heading to the N.E. & under short sail Middle part the same last shore off shore lat 46. 34. 54 Long of Lk 39. 52

Wednesday 9th

This Day Begins with strong winds from the N.W. heading to the N.E. at 7 AM in sail one sail in light Middle part the same last part cramped in showing down in the main both way, lat 46. 39. 31
