Monday November 1st

Hill part the same last part thick
Heavy Weather so ends but by the 36.70

Friday Nov 29

This day begins with fresh winds from the
N. & heavy weather. Heavy S.E. off Portland
Sail caught the middle point wind & set
at 5 A.M. left off S.E. but fresh winds
the Centre line of 62.00. 5.7. Long by the 12.55. 24.00.

Wednesday 3rd 9

This day begins with strong winds from the
N. W. & strong S. E. by E. at 10 AM some
drizzle & snow 10 it did off bursted the 9 AM
drill heading to the N. & E. Middle of hour
back starting off 8 on route that had
but 4 Oct. 98...17 try by the 12.25

Thurs. May 4th

This Log begins with strong winds from the S.W. standing off S. on the second under short sail 41/2 of the land there I lost 10 miles North & lost part a Gale of wind blew off S. in under short sail and sail in sight

E. blowing off shore to the W. At 4 the land
Bore S. S. E. Dist 15 Miles Still past tending
to the S. E. but just blowing strong to land.
Sat 9th 37.10 W. by S. 11.00

Sunday 4th

This day begins with strong winds from the N.E. during the afternoon but subsiding 8 Squally & cold but no gales from the N. at 4.60 37° 55' Day 4th 7° 49'

Monday 26th

This Day Begins with fresh golds from the
 or off being well under that soil
 Middle part and W. last sent. Many golds from
 the S.W. with 2 grains of silver but gold 37.00,
 by 4th 9.11 of

Sunday 9th

This day begins with strong gales from the
S.W. kept off E. & S.E. off night two heading to the
N. W. off with 3 last first light winds from
the N. & E. but by 4.15

Long of the 8. 15

Wednesday 14th

This day begins with light winds from the S
around the Forenoon. Haze is & heaviest again
at 4. Double kept the topsails Steering S by E
Midella & lost part five men the Sperry to
the S.
