This Day Begins with strong wind from the S.W. Erupt in cutting the head off & finished at the North of beyond Rail leading to the middle of last post blowing a gale of wind from the S.E. Lat 40° 31' 30" Long 4th 182° 11'

Friday 29th

This Day Begins with strong gales from the E.S.E. leading to the S. Erupt in Boiling at 7 21 the Watch one mile in sight of the middle part. Above moderate sea. Just saw French rock bearing N.W. Dist 25 Miles Lat by alt 51° 45' Long 4th 181° 06' above rock, 17° 06'

Saturday 30th

This Day Begins with fresh winds from the N.E. spoke the steamer of the Bedford 2200 Tons Erupt in Boiling at 6 mile ship to the S.E. the Rock bearing N.W. Dist 12 Miles Middle part leading to the S.E. Lat just leading to the S.E. Lat 40° 31' 30" Long 4th 180° 59'

Sunday May 1st

This Day Begins with strong winds from the N.W. Erupt in Boiling at 7 21 the Watch one ship to the S. Middle part the head of the S. spoke the former steamer of the Bedford 1200 tons Lat just bearing to the S.E. Lat 40° 31' 30" Long 4th 179° 30' West

Monday 2d

This Day Begins with strong winds from the N.W. at 5 P.M. finished Boiling Middle part bearing 8 Below weather last part wind S.W. leading to the S.W. Lat 40° 32' 00" Long 4th 178° 39' West

Tuesday May 3d

This Day Begins with fresh winds from the S.W. throughout the 2 mile in sight at 6 mile in sight of the middle part the same last part Erupt in blowing down from French Rock 2 mile in sight to the S.E. Lat 40° 31' 30" Long 4th 179° 02' West North, 17° 10'

Wednesday 4th

This Day Begins with fine weather Erupt in blowing down the head 4 miles off at 6 finished blowing 2 mile in sight Middle part the same last part then to the S. 2 mile in sight Lat 40° 31' 00" Long 4th 178° 50'

Thursday 5th

This Day Begins with fresh winds from the E.S.E. leading to the S. Erupt at 6 21 below sea now ship to the S. Middle 8 last part blowing a gale from the E. with rain Lat 40° 31' 50" Long 4th 180° 50'

Friday 6th

This Day Begins with fresh gales from the E. leading to the S. the Centre of clouds at 1 the same bore at 2 P.M. the same last part last part fresh rain & heavy weather Lat 40° 30' 15" Long 4th 180° 40'

Saturday 7th

This Day Begins with strong gales from the S. with thick rain weather now ship to the S. at 6 cleared up at 6. More again to the S. Middle part the same last part leading to the S. Lat 40° 30' 30" Long 4th 179° 05' West

Sunday 8th

This Day Begins with strong wind from the E.S.E. blowing at the S. at 6 the head last part the middle part the same last part saw the French Rock last part leading to the S.E. Lat 40° 30' 00" Long 4th 178° 50' West
