This day begins with fresh winds from the N.E. some heavy at 5 P.M. took our repoles to the ship & made them fast. A terrible storm wind last part. Emph in cutting blowing a gale Sat 4 Oct 39.00 Temp of Sk 18.0.30

Friday 24th

This day begins with a gale from the N.E. trying
to cut A.C. got one head off & 3 rapid cutting but
heavy rain still the part the same last part
finished one whole blowing a gale but the 3.15-
long by the 14.00 & 20

Saturday 25th

This Bay begins with a gale from the N & E with heavy rain but up the fork & cleared up the decks one whole day tide windle just the same last part heavy & breezy but in the other whole part of the 23. 30 by 4 at 150000

Sunday 26th

This Day Begins with fresh winds from the N
W began to hail here in the frank Middle &
last part. Kept the then. one Indian light
sent by the 8th or
sent by the 18th or 9

Monday Feb 27th

This day begins with strong winds from the W & E in the morning and in night. At 7 AM the water middle part the lower part just yoke the former channel to end. Set by Oct. 33.30 Day 4th 1801 33

Tuesday 28th

this day Mexico with strong winds from
the N. W. Expt in sailing at 4 finished
Wore ship to the SW last port heading to
the N. E. trail in light lat by Ch. 39. 11
by Ch 150. 60

Wednesday March. 18th

This Day Begins with strong winds & Squally
Weather At 6 P.M. rode ship to the S & W
had Minor Squalls & Hail & Last part strong
gales but by Chr. 33. 17 say by Chr. 1. 1. 05.

Thursday 22

This Day Begins with fresh gold from the U.S.M.
At 2 P.M. Home ship to the U.S. West port & Eng'd
in Storing Down at 12 finished Sat by 8.55.07
by 4th 1800.45

This Day Begins with fine ^{br} winds from the S, not
hardy to the N & W at sunset shortened sail while
to last part light winds Lat of obs. 32° 50'
Long by Ch 150° 12'

September 4th

This Day Begins with Light-Minds from the I
leading to the W. H. & shortened 2nd Hill's part leading
to the N. last part how one mile "Hill's"
Sat. 4 Oct. 31st 48 Day of the 1800th 15

Sunday 3rd

This Dry begins with fresh winds from the E
Theory of the heat 'At 6 P.M. wind fresh west
Baromy E. Dist 35 Miles off shore & East part landing
to the N. have rising
