

Remarks On Board Of Vessel Lydia Of New Bedford

September 29th 1866. Saturday.

Continued strong breeze from the N. W. with snow in squally heading to the westward under short sail. Middle part the same at 6 AM kept off S. E. W. in company with the other ships. 9.30. Saw the land East Cape. 10.30 saw the Diamond at Meridian abreast of them. Ends pretty fair weather considering

Sunday Sept 30th

Commenced fresh breeze from N. W. Steering S. E. 4 Bell spoke fish Perry. Middle part moderate. Lying back on account of Dec. 5 AM kept off S. W. by South light breeze and cloudy the rest of this day sounded twice 25 and 28 fathoms. 6 ships in sight one boiling.

Monday October 1st 1866

Continued light breeze from N. E. and cloudy steering S. W. 3 PM Capt. Taber of the Three B. came on board. Middle part light breeze steered S. W. Sounded through the night several times. Latter part strong breeze and squally steering S. S. W. and S. W. the land on the Western shore in sight and St. Lawrence Island at Meridian it bore E. S. E. distance 20 miles. 7 ships

Tuesday Oct 2nd

Strong breeze first part of this day from W. N. W. steering S. W. Strong Gale and rugged steering S. W. Latter part more moderate steering S. E. 1 sail in sight
Lat Obs 62.26 N. Long by Chron 172.58 W

Wednesday Oct 3rd

Moderate breeze from W. N. W. steering S. E. spoke the Arnolda & Whaley stand South until midnight. Lay aback until heading N. W. 5 AM kept off heading S. E. Latter part strong breeze from N. N. E. steering S. E. by S. Saw Gonz Island bearing East.

Thursday October 4th 1866

Continued strong breeze from N. N. E. with squally of snow steering S. E. passed Gore Island. we are bowing it along and double reef. in company with Arnolda Middle part the same. Latter part fresh breeze and squally steering S. E. by South 4 ships in sight. So Ends
Lat Obs 57.38 N Long by Chron 172.08 W

Friday Oct 5th

The wind and weather continues the same steering S. E. by S. Middle and latter part moderate breeze but quite rugged from the N. W. steering most of the time S. E. by S. in company with the Arnolda spoke her at 10 AM. Saw Pinbacks
Lat Obs 53.33 N Long by Chron 171.50 W

Saturday Oct 6th

Moderate breeze the first part of this day from N. N. W. steering S. E. by S. Middle part the same Latter part light breeze from the South steering by the wind sent up fore top G. and sail and sat it. So Ends
Lat Obs 54.00 N Long by Chron 170.54 W

Sunday Oct 7th

Continued light breeze from the South steering by the wind to W. S. W. Middle part heading South. Latter part fresh breeze and squally from W. N. W. heading S. S. W. Saw 2 or 3 Islands to the S. E. of us. Supposed near the entrance of the 172 passage. Fox Islands
Lat Obs 53.10 N. Long by Chron 171.46 W

Monday Oct 8th

Fresh breeze and squally from W. N. W. steering S. S. W. and South. through the passage saw 7 ships & C. E. steered S. by E. Strong breeze from N. W. the rest of this day steering S. E. by S. and S. E. 2 sails in sight
Lat Obs 50.40 N. Long by Chron 170.54 W
