Continues Strong breeze from N. W. and quite a bad crop sea Steering S. E. Middle part the same Latter part moderate Steering S. E. by E. Employed in various

Thursday Oct 11th

Moderate breeze the first part of this day from N. W. Steering S. E. 2 Ships in sight. Middle part fresh breeze from the Eastward Steering to the S. E. E. Latter part Strong breeze inclining to a gale. with rain Ends Rainy

Friday Oct 12th

First part Strong Gale and Rainy from the Eastward heading to the South Under Short. Sail Middle part Moderate breeze with a bad head beat sea heading to the Eastward. Latter part fresh breeze and foggy from the S. E. W. Steering S. E. E.

Saturday Oct 13th

Commences Moderate breeze from S. W. with fog and rain Steering S. E. and S. E. by E. washing the Boat David &c. Middle part the same. Latter part fresh breeze Steering S. E. by E. Watches employed scraping bone &c. Saw one strange sail

Latt Obs 40° 58' N. Long by Chro 162° 00' W
Sunday Oct 14th

Continues the same finished the bone and lashed it up. Steering S. E. by E. Middle and Latter part moderate Steering S. E. by E.

Monday October 15th 1866

First part light breeze from N. W. and Cloudy Steering S. E. by E. Middle part fresh breeze. Latter part Strong breeze and cloudy with squally of rain Employed Repairing fore top 9th Sail. Steering S. E. by E. (Sun Obscure)

Tuesday Oct 16th

Continues Strong breeze from the North and rainy Steering S. E. by E. and S. E. 4 P.M. put 2 reefs in topsail &c. 9 P.M. blowing heavy took in sail to close reef main topsail & staysails and luffed to the wind. Latter part Strong breeze heading to the S. & E. with thunder Lightning and rain. Dirty weather. No Ends

Latt Obs 35° 05' N. Long 157° 27' W

Wednesday Oct 17th

Continues much the same. Middle and Latter part Strong Gale and Rugged from the Eastward heading by the wind on different tack Under Storm Sails. Ends Cloudy with rain squally

Latt Obs 35° 00' N. Long 157° 30' W

Thursday Oct 18th

The wind and weather continues the same. Saw one Bark (Florence). Middle part more moderate. Latter part moderate and squally with rain wind from the S. W. E. to East heading by the wind tacking ship occasionally. the Florence in sight. No Ends
No Obs.

Friday Oct 19th

Strong breeze the first part of this day from the East. 4 P.M. put 2 reefs in fore topsail. Middle part moderate from the S. E. heading East & E. by N. Latter part fresh breeze. Employed in washing bone heading by the wind to the E by N.
