

Remarks. On Board of Bark Lydia of New Bedford

Sunday December 23rd 1866 is

Fine weather first part boats return from fishing no luck. Middle and latter part the same
Lying at Anchor

Monday Dec 24th

Continues the same. the remainder of this day light trades & calm took our anchor and dropped it again in about half an hour. So Ends
Lying at Anchor

Tuesday Dec 25th

Gay Old Christmas
Calm. boats fishing 4 P.M. took our anchor 5.30. came to anchor for the night. got a mess of fish the remainder of this day calm & head wind. boats a fishing returned with a good mess. So Ends
Lying at Anchor.

Wednesday Dec 26th

Same Old story head wind.
the rest of this day the same. Unbent foretop sail to repair finished and bent it again. French Ship came to anchor from lee bay, the Winslow
Lying at Anchor.

Thursday Dec 27th

Fine weather all this day took our anchor and went in under the Island to get water got about 35 bbls. the Fanny left the bay to day.
Lying at Anchor.

Friday Dec 28th

First part fine weather. Middle part the same. Latter part a fine wind took our anchor and left for the lee bay, at meridian off Pelican point. the Winslow left the bay to day
So Ends this day

Thos. W. Hathaway Master Lying at Anchor

Saturday December 29th 1866 is

At 2 P.M. came to anchor in the lee bay. Middle and latter part fine weather two boats and crew cutting wood one boat claming &c. sent up the cutting gear.
Lying at Anchor in lee bay.

Sunday Dec 30th

First part boats returned with some wood and some oysters. Middle part the same. Latter part got off two boats load of wood. Ends the same fine weather
Lying at Anchor in lee bay.

Monday Dec 31st

Fine weather two boats looking about the bay saw nothing. the balance of this day like the first 2 boats crews cutting wood. 1 boat getting oysters.

Tuesday January 1st 1867 is

This day being a new year and I hope it will prove a good one for us and bless us with 1500 bbls oil. Sunset the boats returned. Middle part the same Latter part 2 boats wooding, 1 boat gone to the bark. George who came to anchor up the bay. So Ends this day
Our Capt. " " and " Capt. Davis came on

Wednesday Jan 2nd

Continues the same. 2 P.M. a boat from the U.S. Steamer Swanee came on board. Supplied them with bread. Sugar. Molasses. & Bringer. at night the wood boats returned. Middle part the same. Latter part took off 2 boats load of wood. turned up the boats and took out ceiling. to wash out to paint. & other jobs.

Thursday 3rd Jan

Put out the cutting stage & rigged it. Stowed away the wood. Started a cask of bread
Remainder of this day. Employed in painting boats inside & various other jobs. one boat went a claming and Albert Stephens & Alvin Odway deserted. So Ends
