

Remarks On Board Of Bark Lydia Of N. Y.

Thursday June 13th 1867.

First part light breeze from S. E. and thick dirty weather Steaming N. N. W. Sounded 25 fathoms & saw the land near St. Lawrence Bay and 4 vessels at 9 O'Clock Spoke Bark Arctic bearing Jeffery of New London 5 Whales the season. Saw Cape East and the Diomedes and stood to the North.

Latter part Steered N. N. W. & endy Foggy.

Friday June 14th

Commenced moderate breeze and clear wind from the Southward Steaming N. N. W. Saw Devilfish the Land and 7 vessels 5 Bells Spoke Bark Washington Boker 11 Whales the season. Middle part saw Bowheads lowered for them chased until 8.30 AM. took up boats. Latter part light breeze and Pleasant weather saw Bowheads dodging about did not lower. saw the Land and 12 Ships. To Endy.

Saturday June 15th

Continued fine weather wind S. E. heading to the North Spoke the Mule 1 Whales the ~~season~~ ^{season} ~~the~~ ^{the} Massachusetts 11 Whales the season and boiling. had a Game Middle part light air heading all over the lot. Latter part the same saw 34 Ships 18 boiling. saw plenty of Ice. saw 3 or 4

Sunday June 16th

Continued light breeze from S. E. saw B. H. close to the ship. did not see him again Spoke the Minerva boat 11 Whales the season. 6 O'Clock Capt. Hawes of the Mule came on board and Capt. Taber of the Fire Brothers Lister 11 Whales the season. saw Whales and lowered 1 boat and soon came on board to fish. remainder of this day calm. 10 AM saw

A Bow Head and lowered the boats. Stuck to waist boat at Meridian took him to the ship. 20 Ships in sight some of them chasing and some boiling. To Endy.

The N. B. Hathaway Master in Arctic Ocean

Monday June 17th 1867.

Continued light air and calm at 1.30 began to cut at 5.45 finished. Capt. Rayner of the Rainier came on board a few minutes 11 Whales the season and Capt. Latham of the C. Crocker 5 Whales the season. clearing away the head & Middle part light breeze from S. E. heading various ways. Latter part light breeze Steaming to the North. commenced boiling. saw 23 Ships and Ice. but para Whale. Endy fine weather.

Tuesday June 18th

Fine weather first part of this day and gentle breeze from the S. E. Steaming N. by E. 5 pm Spoke the Big Florida 2 Whales the season. E. Swift 3 Whales. Middle and Latter part moderate breeze from the South heading by the wind on different tack. saw any quantity of Ship. sawd some Ice. Employed in boiling

Lat Obs 68.27 N. Long by Chron 170.10 W

Wednesday June 19th

Still continued fine weather and gentle breeze from the South heading to S. E. 5 pm Spoke the Dies 8 Whales the season. 6 O'Clock saw B. H. lowered the boats for him. To go. took up boats. Middle part fresh breeze. Latter part moderate breeze heading various ways. Employed in storing down oil main Hatch saw B. H. and Ships chasing. Ice & 27 Ships

Lat Obs 67.48 N. Long by Chron 170.30 W

Thursday June 20th

First part light breeze from the Westward heading S. W. by S. by the wind finished Storing down oil. Middle part fresh breeze. Latter part moderate breeze heading N. W. saw Bow Head lowered but could not catch him saw Ice Devilfish and Ships. Employed in scraping bone & Ice.
