

Remarks On Board Of Bark Lydia. Of New Bedford

Saturday July 20th 1867.

First part moderate breeze and fine weather heading various ways 3 pm spoke the Addeline Gam. Middle and latter part calm and foggy. Thick Fog.

Sunday July 21st

Continues light air and foggy. Middle part light breeze heading to S. E. Latter part fresh breeze spoke Corinthian Gam. Ends cloudy smoky weather 25 Ships in sight & see. 1 Ship boiling -
Lat 70° 30' N

Monday July 22nd

Commences moderate breeze from N. E. heading to S. E. spoke St. George. 6 PM spoke Florida Gam. Middle and latter part light breeze from N. E. steering south cloudy smoky foggy weather nothing in sight but ships
Fog or Fog or Fog

Tuesday July 23rd

Continues foggy steering N. W. sailing with the Florida. Middle part calm. Latter part light breeze steering S. E. saw the See and 12 Ships
Lat 69° 40' N. Long by Chron 177° 01' W

Wednesday July 24th

First part light breeze and fine weather lowered the boats when near the See for walrus and caught 11 and got L Boat stove took her in to repair. Middle and latter part light breeze heading to the N. N. E. employed in repairing Stom Boat and cutting up the blubber. Ends cloudy hazy weather

Thursday July 25th

Continues light breeze and smoky cloudy heading to N. E. several ships in sight 3 pm boarded the Martha Gam. Middle and latter part light breeze and cloudy heading N. E. employed in boiling walrus oil. spoke Martha for a Gam. steering to the northward to ends

Friday July 26th 1867

Continues the same as the former. Steering to the north in company with the Martha at 4 pm the John Garver joined the Gam. several vessels in sight and the See. Middle part light breeze. Latter part moderate breeze and foggy. spoke E. Swift Gam. Ends thick fog.

Saturday July 27th

Still continues fresh breeze and foggy 4 pm scouted got 18 fathoms on or near Heard Shoal. Middle part thick fog. Latter part clear weather and very light breeze heading various ways. Nothing in sight but ships & see.
Lat Obs 70° 30' N. Long by Chron 172° 34' W

Sunday July 28th

First part light breeze and clear weather heading to N. E. spoke John Howland Gam. Middle and latter part fresh breeze from the eastward and thick fog.

Monday July 29th

Thick fog to begin this day with spoke the Massachusetts of S. S. at 8 PM spoke the George nothing since we saw her last. Middle part fresh breeze and hazy. Latter part saw several ships had a Gam with the George. Ends foggy.

Tuesday July 30th

Thick dirty weather heading by the wind in company with the George. saw the See. F. C. thick and foggy. Middle and latter part strong breeze from the E. S. E. and foggy dirty weather. at intervals clear. for a few minutes

Wednesday July 31st

Continues the same 4 pm spoke the Tanny 310 lbs the Season Gam. Middle part foggy. Latter part strong breeze and cloudy hazy weather with occasional gleams of the sun. Saw 4 ships. steering various ways
Lat 70° 31' N
