Remarks on board Ship *Majestic* Tuesday September 8th

This day comes in with pleasant breezes from the S.E. lying off and on at 4 Pm the boat came off with 3 pigs 5 chickens and a message from Capt. etc. that he would stay ashore above Ship heading off shore with the main yard aback back in the topgallant sails flying jib and baird up the courses the middle part sharp light and heavy thunder from the S.E. lying off and on at the latter part heavy squalls of wind and rain at 9 Am the boat went ashore fore left no more the cooper still remains unfit for duty.

Remarks Wednesday September 9th

Comes in with heavy squalls of rain strong breeze from the S.E. at 4 Pm the boat came off with one man a Portugee several hogs and chickens employed on breaking out flour and Pork at 6 Pm the boat went ashore the middle part light air from the S.E. at 8 Pm a fine breeze springing up from the Southward the boat came off with Capt. etc. at the same time kept off and run to the leeward of the Island the cooper still off duty.

Remarks Thursday September 10th

Light breeze from the S.W. on the wind on the Larboard tack 2 sails in sight to the Westward employed on the rigging the middle and latter parts calm employed on breaking out water and bread so ends the cooper is better and ~~perfectly~~ fit for duty.

Remarks on board of Ship *Majestic* Friday September

Comes in with light breezes from the Westward at 3 Pm the wind veered to the Southward with rain employed on stripping canbocks one sail in sight to the Southward the middle part calm at 3 Am the wind springing up from the E.S.E. steaming S by E employed on putting up the forge.

Remarks on board Saturday September 12th

Pleasant breezes and fine weather employed on making lance warps steaming per compass S.E. Several sails in sight to the S.W. the remainder of the day light air from the E.S.E. on the wind on the Larboard tack employed on sending down the main spencer gift and making a new one so ends these 24 hours.

Remarks Sunday September 13th

This day comes in with light breezes from the E.S.E. on the heading South one sail in sight to the S.E. The blacksmith employed on making bands and hoes for the gift the remainder of the day light and baffling winds nothing occurring worthy of note.
