Comes in with light breezes from the S.E. on the wind on the Starboard tack the middle part squalls of rain accompanied with thunder and lightning at 2 Am broke out Beef and Pork at 11 Am eased away the flying jibboom in as squall took in the topgallant sails several sails in sight all of the middle and later parts strong breezes from the N.E. steering per compass S.W. at 12 M set the topgallant sails

No. Observation

Remarks Tuesday September 15th

Comes in with strong breezes from the E.N.E. steering S.E. by S. warily employed at 2 Am the wind veered to the S.W. the latter part squally weather at 5 Am took in the topgallant sails employed on making a new flying jibboom so ends

Lat 10 24 N Long 21 26 W

Remarks Wednesday September 16th

The fore part strong breezes from the S.W. and sang employed on the boom on the wind on the Starboard tack at 5 Pm set the main topgallant sails the latter part light breezes employed much the same one sail in sight to the Westward heading S.E. so ends

Lat 14 2 North Long 20 37 West

Remarks on board Ship Majestic Thursday September

Light airs from W. S.W. steering S.E. employed on making the flying jibboom at 4 Pm the wind veered shore to the Southward employed on sitting up rigging the wind and weather continues about the same

Lat 11 N Long 19 48 W

Remarks Friday September 18th

This day the fore part light breezes from the S.W. steering per compass S.E. employed on sending out the flying jib boom and flying jib. at 4 Pm broke out water the remainder of the day light and baffling winds at 7 Am broke out flour beef and rice and coffee

Lat 8 34 Long 19 05

Remarks Saturday September 19th

Light breezes from the S.W. at 4 Pm fresh breezes from the same quarter steering S.E. all sail set the middle and latter part baffling winds and squally weather nothing occurring worthy of note
