Remarks on board of Ship *Majestic* Saturday September 26th

Comes in with fresh breezes from the Southward on the Larboard tack heading *NW by W* employed on breaking out Bread Beans and water the remainder of the day moderate breezes and pleasant weather on the wind with all sail set nothing worthy of remark occurring so ends in

Remarks Sunday September 27th

Moderate breezes from the Southward heading *SW by W* employed on the rigging the latter part heading most of the time *SW* at 6 Pm cast a Porpoise saw one finback so ends these 24 hours

Remarks Monday September 28th

Light breezes from *S by E* on the Larboard tack heading *SW by W* at 12 past 1 Pm saw blackfish larboard the boats and the mast boat fastened and took him to the Ship got a cowfish at the same time the latter part employed on mincing the blubber so ends

Remarks on board of Ship *Majestic* Tuesday September 29th

The fore part of these 24 hours moderate breezes from the Southward on the wind heading most of the time *NW by W* variously employed on Ship duty at 7 Pm tacked Ship heading to the *SE* with light airs at 10 Pm tacked Ship and headed *SW by W* with strong breezes took in the flying jib the fore and mizzen topgallant sails

Remarks Wednesday September 30th

Comes in with strong breezes from the Southward on the Larboard tack heading *SW by W* nothing of importance occurring the middle part strong breezes and squally weather the latter part more moderate employed on trying out the blackfish so ends this day Capt. M. is unable to be on deck on account of a bad eye and a gathering in his hand Lat 190 N Long 1426 W

Remarks Thursday October 1st

The fore part pleasant with moderate breezes from *N by E* on the wind with all sail set heading most of the time *SW by W* finished trying out the latter part strong breezes and squally the steward is off duty on account of sickness or rheumatism in the leg
