Remarks on board Ship Majestic Sunday November 1st

Came in with strong breeze from the S.E. as the wind on the Starboard tack employed on trying out at 4 Am broke out Bread the latter part fresh breeze employed on trying out at 11 Am finished boiling the Cooper and Steward still unable to do duty

Remarks Monday November 2nd

Fine breeze and clear weather at 2 Am tacked Ship heading to the Westward saw one finback employed on clearing up decks the latter part light breeze from the S.E. on the wind on both tacks with all sail set at 7 Am broke out water so much

Lat 36° 32' South Long 11° 28'

Remarks Tuesday November 3rd

Light and pleasant breeze from the S.E. on the Starboard tack nothing occurring of importance at 4 Am tacked Ship heading to the N.W. by S at 7 Am broke out molasses

Lat 36° 20' Long 11° 27'

Remarks on board Ship Majestic of New Bedford Wednesday November 4th

Pleasant breeze from the S.W. by S and clear weather on the Starboard tack with all sail set the latter part light air and calm at 8 Am the mast and lower boat went in shore a fishing and to look for whales the remainder of the crew employed on stowing down the Cooper and Steward is about the same

Remarks Thursday November 5th

The fore part light breeze from the South by E and on, employed on stowing down at 4 Am the boats came off finished stowing down at the same time one sail in sight the latter part the wind veered to the S.E. on the wind on the Starboard tack so ends this day

Remarks Friday November 6th

The fore part of these 24 hours light breeze from the S.E. at 1 Am tacked Ship heading S.W. the middle part calm the latter part light breeze from the S.W. heading S.E. employed on repairing the mast boat unbeat the spanker and beat a sloot mizzen
