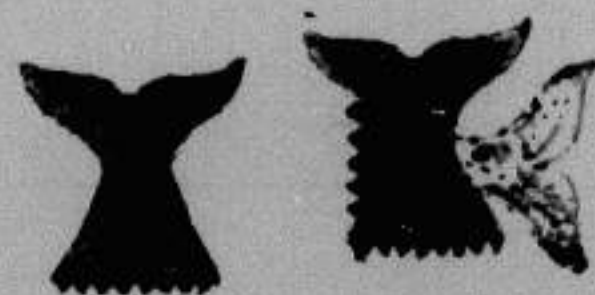

Remarks on board Ship Majestic of New Bedford Saturday November 7th

Breeze from the N.E. steering per
Compass S.E. employed on fitting the fore
topmast standing sail went the fore topmast
stay sail and bent another in its place at 2
Pm set the fore topmast standing sail the latter
part fresh breeze at 4 Am saw right whales
forward but could not fasten at 4 Am the
boats came on board at half past 10 Am saw
more whales toward the bow so ends

Remarks Sunday November 8th

Came in with strong breeze at 4 Pm
the boats came aboard kept off S.E.
the latter part strong breeze with rain
at 10 Am put 2 reefs in the topsails
and 2 Porpoises at the same time

Remarks Monday November 9th

The fore part light gales from the
N.E. steering S.E. by E at 1 Pm took in
the fore mainsail and mizzen topsail at
4 Pm more moderate the latter part
light breeze steering E.S.E. with all
sail set the Howard and Cooper is
the same as usual

Remarks on board of Ship Majestic Tuesday November 10th

light breeze from the N.W. steering per
Compass S.E. at 4 Am hove out Bait and
hook the remainder of the day fresh breeze
and pleasant weather employed on tarring
down the potatoe bin saw nothing

Remarks Wednesday November 11th

Fresh breeze and clear steering E.S.E. at
2 Pm hove out water saw one humpback
the latter part light breeze from the
Westward nothing occurring of importance
the Howard continues the same the Cooper
is some better one sail in sight to the
S.E.

Remarks Thursday November 12th

Came in with light breeze from the
S.W. steering E.S.E. a heavy swell rising
from the S.W. the middle part calmer
winds and squally with the latter
part light gales from the S.W. and
wester at half past 11 Am spoke the
Scarlett of London
