Remarks on board Ship *Majestic* of New Bedford Friday November 13th

Light gales blowing ESE with main topgallant sail set at 3 Pm put one reef in the fore topsail saw one finback the middle part more moderate at 11 Pm the wind veered to the NW at 7 Am unbent the fore topsail and bent another in its place the rest of the day employed on repairing the topsail so ends

Lat 39°29' Long 72° East

Remarks Saturday November 14th

Strong breeze from the NW steering ESE with all sail set finished repairing the topsail at 3 Pm broke out bread the middle part moderate breeze with light squalls of rain the light breeze and hazy weather the latter part at 7 Pm said a Porpoise

Lat 39°14' S Long 70°22' E



Remarks Sunday November 15th

These 24 hours the first part light breezes variously employed steering ESE the middle part much the same at 4 Am the wind commenced to breeze up from the NW this day ends with strong breezes steering the latter part SE by E one sail in sight to the NW

Remarks on board of Ship *Majestic* Monday November 16th

Began in with light gales from the NW steering per compass SE by E under 2 reefed fore and mizzen topsails and one reef in the main at 10 Pm the wind commenced to veer to the Westward the latter part strong breezes and clear saw several finbacks

Lat 39°38' Long 18°48'

Remarks Tuesday November 17th

Strong breeze from the Westward steering SE by E with all sail set saw several finbacks the remainder of the day the weather continues the same at 7 Am carried away the fore topmast standing sail boom so ends the Cooper gets some better the Steward is about the same

Lat 39°42' Long 21°09'

Remarks Wednesday November 18th

Pleasant breezes and fair weather steering SE by E nothing occurring of importance the middle part light airs and calms the latter part fresh breezes from the SE and ESE employed on breaking out Beef and Pork Codfish and Flour Water saw several finbacks
