Remarks on board of Ship Majestic Monday December 7th

These 24 hours comes in with pleasant breezes from the Northward steering E S E saw several finbacks the remainder of the day strong breezes at 7 AM Joseph King fell from the fore topgallant yard overboard towards the boat and picked him up without any perceptible injury employed on breaking out water

Remarks Tuesday December 8th

Strong breezes from the N N E on the wind heading E S S nothing occurring of importance the weather continues the same throughout the day nothing in sight on the wind heading E S S so ends these 24 hours

Remarks Wednesday December 9th

Cloudy weather with strong breezes from the N N E on the wind in the Harbours tack at 4 AM broke out Beef and Pork the middle part strong breezes the latter part light gales from the Northward heading E S E nothing occurring worthy of note

Remarks on board of Ship Majestic Thursday December 10th

Light gales from the Northward and steady weather on the wind heading E S E the middle and latter parts light gales with fogs and rain heading the same saw nothing the Blacksmith is off duty on account of a rupture so ends these days

Remarks Friday December 11th

These 24 hours comes in with strong breezes from the N N steering E by S the remainder of the day moderate breeze and thick hazy weather at 11 AM first saw Amsterdam Island bearing S E kept off E by S so ends

Remarks Saturday December 12th

Strong breezes and hazy weather at 1 PM the 2 quarter and waist boats went in shore fishing at 5 PM came off and kept off E S E at 2 PM the wind veered to the S W the latter part sailed 2 barrels of fish
