Comes in with light pleasant breezes but baffling employed in lashing anchors and stowing down chains The latter part nothing of importance occurring all this day Capt Macomber and myself has been confined below In having a colic with severe pain in the abdomen whilst Capt M was taken with vomiting

Remarks Saturday February 6th

Commences with light and variable winds at one P.M. took Ship wind continues light throughout the day the Capt and myself continues the same

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Remarks on board of Ship Majestic Sunday February 7th

Three or four comes in with light breezes from the N.E. and very pleasant steering N.E. I get some better the Capt continues the same

Remarks Monday February 8th

This day comes in with light wind from the W.N.W. steering per compass N. The latter part the wind hauled to the Southward with light rain employed on making boat sails I still continue to get better the Capt is the same

Lat 32° 01 Long 177° 57 West

Remarks Tuesday February 9th

This day comes in with moderate winds from the S.E. steering N. with pleasant weather broke out Bitter the latter part fresh breezes from the same quarter the Capt still continues sick but gets on deck occasionally
